The society will hold an annual meeting and various meetings throughout the year at the discretion of the executive.

However, delivery was expected later that week and the contractor had promised to put on a double crew to install it. Business Administrator Percy Laframboise reported, so that the school still might be ready for the first day of school in September.

EVE'S HOLLYWOOD, A CONFESSORIAL LOS ANGELES NOVEL — by Eve Babitz.
