The purpose of By-law 62-74 is to prohibit the parking of all vehicles in a front yard unless on a driveway not more than 20 feet in width.

Following is a brief explanation of the said by-law:

By-law number 65-74 affects lands on the north side of Birch Avenue approximately 175 feet east of Bathurst Street. A plan of subdivision is proposed as shown on the schedule to the by-law. The lands are zoned Residential R2 by By-law 2523 of Vaughan. This requires a 60-foot frontage. The proposed lots have a front lot line of 60 feet but when the frontage is measured 30 feet back from the lot line it is only 59.3 feet. The purpose of By-law 65-74 is to reduce the required minimum frontage of the proposed lots to 59.3 feet.
