Ace Squash Player Joins Markham

Gulmast Khan, one of a family well known in international squash circles, has joined the Markham Fitness and Racquet Club as its full-time professional. Gulmast, who has been playing professionally since 1972, will compete in the Boston Invitational at the end of October carrying the Markham Fitness and Racquet Club colors. The Boston Invitational is a competition among the top 16 squash players in North America. In January he hopes his Boston standing will take him to the North American Open in Mexico City. Khan's father is Hashim Khan, seven-time World Champion, and at age 62,

still competing in major tournaments. Gulmast's brother Sharif, is the present North American champion, a title he has held four times. Sharif Khan is the professional at the Toronto Granite Club.

CAREER DECISION

Gulmast was educated in England and the United States, is married and is now a resident here. He diverted his career to squash in 1972 and has devoted all his time to it since then.

The Markham Club sent an emissary to England where he was on tour to set up the arrangement.

As squash professional at Markham Fitness and Racquet, Gulmast will be available for instruction and lessons. He is an avid squash promoter of recreation as an excellent way of keeping in top physical and mental condition. He will advise members on equipment and clothing and will hold group squash clinics as well as give individual instruction.

CLUB EXPANSION

Markham Fitness and Racquet will provide, in addition to squash, tennis, swimming and gym facilities, a full complement of extras, such as saunas, whirlpools and lounges. The new addition will provide for the men's gymnasium, three single squash courts and one double squash court with gallery. The gallery will serve both for tournaments and instruction.

Mr. Khan will be playing at the Fitness Institute Invitational September 13 to 15, a major squash event in North America, if you should wish to see him in action.
