

# Thornhill All-Star Squirt Selects Continue Winning Ways At Malton Meet

With the Oak Ridges tournament victory still in their minds, the Squirt house league Selects travelled to Wildwood Park in Malton on Saturday. Entrants such as Richmond Hill, Eringate, and Alderwood promised the keenest test of skill to any who dared challenge their traditional dominance of these tournaments. Richmond Hill were '72 and '73 winners. Feeling the effect of August vacations, the Thornhill All-Stars were bolstered with new fielders Bruce Catoen and David Alberico, and new first baseman Ed MacDonald. Back up pitcher John Adams had not seen duty on the slab as yet, but had been working out daily to add some additional control to his great speed.

Starting positions for the first game were Larry Darby pitching, brother Mike catching, Ed MacDonald on first, John Adams on second, Steve Daurio at third, brother Greg at shortstop, Bruce Catoen in left field, Bobby Alberico in centre and brother David in right. Of the nine starting players, three sets of two were brothers, and two of these sets were identical twins.

In the first inning, Chinguacousy No. 2 were held scoreless on one hit, while Thornhill came back with five runs on five hits to take an early and decisive lead over what proved later to be a fairly strong team. Matching Chinguacousy's one run in the second, Thornhill held them scoreless in the third while chalking up four more

runs on three hits. At curfew, Thornhill had won 11-3. Pitcher Larry Darby had allowed only seven hits, and given up three bases on balls, while fanning three of 20 batters he faced.

In other games of the first round, Chinguacousy No. 1 edged Eringate 10-9, Alderwood downed Malton 7-4, and Richmond Hill drew a bye.

**SECOND ROUND**  
In the second round, Malton met Chinguacousy No. 1, Bramalea's second entry. Although they had edged Eringate in the first round, they were not considered as strong as their No. 2 team. Planning for a possible five games, coaches Stan Levine and Stan Daurio decided this was the time to relieve pitcher Darby, and to determine the extent to which John Adams might be used later. Darby took second, as Adams warmed up.

This second game was no contest. Allowing only a single hit, and giving up four walks while fanning 10 of 19 batters, John Adams led the Thornhill defence in holding Chinguacousy No. 1 to only two runs. Batting 1,000 and chalking up Thornhill's first homerun, Adams also figured strongly in the 15 runs scored against Chinguacousy No. 1.

In other games in this round, Chinguacousy No. 2 eliminated Eringate 4-2, Alderwood shut out Richmond Hill 8-0, and Malton drew a bye.

**THIRD ROUND**  
In the third game, Thornhill met Alderwood, the only other undefeated team thus far — and after the impres-

sive victory over Richmond Hill, the strong favorite in this contest. With a possible three games yet to be played in the event of a loss here, the Thornhill coaches decided to save Darby for the critical final games. They hoped Adams could repeat some of the performance he showed in the game No. 2.

Holding Alderwood scoreless on one hit in the first, Thornhill again proved their mastery on the bases, stealing everything that their opposition would allow, and accumulating five runs on

four hits. Alderwood scored twice on two hits in the second, while Thornhill replied with only one to close the inning 6-2. In the third, Alderwood gained more ground with two more runs on three hits, as Thornhill's offence was fruitless.

On a great double play in the fourth, by Ed MacDonald, as he caught an infield drive and cut off the runner returning to first, the Alderwood advance was halted. The game ended 6-4 with a victory scored by the Thornhill squad, who had won a double bye to the grand final

as the only undefeated team.

In other games in this round, Malton was eliminated 6-2 by Chinguacousy No. 2, and Chinguacousy No. 1 was eliminated 9-5 by Richmond Hill. This meant that as the only teams having lost only one game, Alderwood again tackled Richmond Hill in the consolation final, and downed the tired Richmond Hill club by 15-8.

**FINAL ROUND**  
The only changes made by Thornhill for the final game were the replacement of left fielder Bruce Catoen with latecomer Pat Dickie, and the switch of Steve and Greg Daurio between third and short stop. Pitcher John Adams started the final game.

Eager for the final victory, Thornhill pounded out seven

hits, including homeruns by Larry Darby and Bobby Alberico, and a triple by John Adams to start the first with an impressive eight runs. Not to be cooled so quickly, Alderwood replied with four runs off four hits. Thornhill added two in the second on a homerun by Adams, and another in the fourth on still another homerun by Adams.

Alderwood was held scoreless in the second, third and fourth innings, to finish the fourth 11-4. Alderwood came back with three runs on three hits in the fifth after holding Thornhill scoreless. But the drive was too little too late, as Thornhill ended the game 14-8 after seven innings, on a final finger-tip catch by shortstop Steve Daurio, just inches from the "out-of-play" line.

**TRUE CHAMPIONS**

They had done it. They had met the best, and they were the best. Pitching of Larry Darby and John Adams was a major factor in the tournament. Mike Darby was a standout catcher. And the big bats of John Adams (.889) with two homers, Steve Daurio (.636) Mike Darby (.556) and David Alberico (.545) were more than enough to reckon with. By the end of the tournament, the Thornhill athletes had warmed the hearts of the officials and spectators with their excellence of play, their sportsmanship, and their calm and confident play through tense periods. They were good students, anxious to improve their skills, a delight to coach, true champions.




