Daurio seeks North Thornhill Ward 2 Markham seat

Calling himself one of the most active people in Thornhill community af-

fairs, Stan Daurio of 31 Silver Aspen Drive, has announced his candidacy for Markham's Ward 2 seat.

He will oppose Ted Foster of 61 Romfield Circuit. Incumbent Roy Muldrew is making a bid for one of two Regional council seats.

Daurio is currently registrar for the Thornhill Community Hockey League and convener of Thornhill's Softball rep team program.

"The continuing challenge for Markham Council is the need for people from many communities to work together as one," he said in a press release.

Careful planning "Regional government coupled with rapid

population and industrial growth continues to generate difficult problems which have a multiplicity of priorities," he continued. "Dealing with all these problems has required and will continue to require very careful planning."

Daurio is pleased with Thornhill's new community centre and the improvement of the water supply and transportation services.

"Thornhill residents have created an exciting and active community. Its people are acutely aware of issues, and are generally more demanding and critical with respect to the quality and extent of facilities, programs and planning," he said.

Daurio feels his commitment to preserve the vitality of Thornhill will not conflict with his commitment to work for the benefit of the town as a whole.

"I've worked for several years with the people of Thornhill, Unionville and Markham," he said. "Now I want to continue that work in a different way."

Community service Daurio is a founding member of the Baythorn Home and School Association and the North Thornhill Community Association; and founder of the North Thornhill Recreation Association and of the Thornhill Softball League.

A recent graduate of York

University, Daurio is a financial analyst for Bell Canada and is responsible for co-ordination of a billion dollar annual budget for Bell's Ontario operations.

He, wife Linda, and their three sons, Rick, Steve, and Greg have been Thornhill residents for nine years.

Ward 2 is bounded by the Toronto Ladies Golf Course, Highway 7, Yonge Street and the proposed Highway 404, east of Bayview Avenue.
