The approaches length is 16 feet from the back edge to the foul line. The balls weigh from three pounds six ounces to three pounds 10 ounces; there are two sizes (diameters) of balls. The "A" ball 5 inches plus or minus 1.32 inch and the "B" ball 4 15-16 inches. Next week I'll have the vital statistics of the bowling pin.
