Richmond Hill Mayor William Lazenby this week reports to the electors of this municipality on his responsibility as a town representative on the council of the Regional Municipality of York. Mayor Lazenby is running for re-election for a two-year term December 2.

Regional responsibility
 "In my original announcement to seek re-election I deliberately omitted my role as a representative of this

municipality, in liaison with our two regional councillors, on the council of the Regional Municipality of York. My role at that level, as well as representing the views of the Richmond Hill Council, is as chairman of the health & social services committee, having served during my first term as vice-chairman.

This position carries with it as well the chairmanship of the York Regional Board of Health, an autonomous body

governing the York Regional Health Unit, and the chairmanship of the board of management of the York Manor Home for the Aged. I also serve the regional level of government as an appointee to the Children's Aid Society and the Richmond Hill and Thornhill Area Family Services board of directors.

Although my attendance at formal meetings of these agencies has not been the best, I have supported both at meetings and in

delegations to promote and continue their services. As you may appreciate, my local appointment as a representative on the York Central Hospital Board is a very beneficial liaison between the hospital and the various departments and agencies with which I serve.

Health and social services
 "The health and social services committee has probably the broadest role of any committee of regional council, encompassing the field of

social services which include welfare administration, counselling agencies, and day care centres, and plumbing inspection services, and as well the committee serves as the nucleus for the board of health.

Board of health
 The York Regional Health Unit, with offices in Richmond Hill, Newmarket, and Sutton, is under the control of this board, and under the administration of Dr. Owen Slingerland, MOH, and Dr.

Ian Kerr, Assistant MOH. "The various departments of the unit are:
 • The dental division which involves school preventive dental programmes, fluoride treatment, and surveys.
 • The nursing division, involving programmes of prenatal education, hospital liaison, venereal disease education, developmental screening and vision, and audiometer screening.

each provides, is not easily understood, and for this reason I have instigated the preparation of a brochure which outlines these various departments and details their specific services. Our committee, and council, have approved such and I expect the brochure will be available in the immediate future for distribution to the public.

"In my campaign for the mayor's office in 1969, I disagreed with the implementation of regional government for the former County of York, having taken umbrage with the method of implementation by which the county council had made representation to the province without consultation with, and input by, the constituent local municipalities. Having successfully obtained this office, and having had regional government implemented, I realized that it was incumbent on the members of regional council to tackle this form of government and make it work efficiently.

This was done, and is continually being worked at by the regional council to take the most beneficial advantage of the provincial subsidies which are available to regional corporations. Such action is evidenced by the greater number of roads which were taken under regional jurisdiction, and the expanded police service.

"The integration liaison of your mayor and regional councillors with local and regional administrations, is able to produce a smooth operation of inter-cooperation benefiting all of our citizens", said candidate Lazenby.

With regard to York Manor, this board is responsible for approval of admission applications, and release of assets, as well as working with the administrative authorities under Barry Smith for the general upkeep of the building, activity programmes for the residents, and their continual care and attention.

"I can appreciate that comprehension of these various fields of service, and the specific service

































