social services which inwelfare ministration, counselling agencies, and day care centres, and plumbing inspection services, and as well the committee serves as the nucleus for the board of health.

Board of health The York Regional Health Unit, with offices in Richmond Hill, Newmarket, and Sutton, is under the control of this board, and under the

administration of Dr. Owen

Slingerland, MOH, and Dr.

Ian Kerr, Assistant MOH. "The various departments of the unit are:

 The dental division which involves school preventive dental programmes, fluoride treatment, and surveys.

• The nursing division, involving programmes of prenatal education, hospital liaison, venereal disease education, developmental screening and vision, and audimeter screening.

• The home care programme, which is a community based health service operating as branch of the home care and rehabilitation services of the Ministry of Health and completely funded by the province. The aim is to provide a planned programme of care for patients requiring active treatment in the home setting.

• The environmental health programme, which has the active role in protection to the public through continual inspection of water supplies, sewerage systems, subdivision and land development, recreation sanitation, pest control, food control, school inspections and health education.

York Manor

With regard to York Manor, this board is responsible for approval of admission applications, and release of assets, as well as working with the administrative authorities under Barry Smith for the general upkeep of the building, activity programmes for residents, and their con-




