

King was his life

Saturday will be a busy day for Harold Rose, clerk-treasurer of the Township of King since September 1, 1937. He is to be honored at a reception followed by a testimonial dinner, then a social evening and dance at Eaton Hall on Seneca College's King Campus.

When he first took office, Rose's annual retainer of \$1,500 had to cover not only his salary, but cost of renting, heating and staffing the municipal building in Nobleton. Fortunately his wife, Ruth, was available and capable and willing to work as his secretary for four and one-half years.

As urban centres in King expanded and new ones sprang up, the municipal staff was enlarged. As Rose pointed out in a chat with "The Liberal", it takes as much administrative time to deal with home services as it does with a farm. In some instances there is even more work involved in servicing a house with water, hydro, sanitary services, and there is four times as much billing involved in the quarterly levy of property taxes as there used to be when tax bills were sent out once a year.

Nobleton native
Harold Rose is not worried about retirement. He lives in a house in Nobleton next door to the one in which he was born, has hobbies and a garden. Furthermore, it is the municipality's intention to keep him on salary, giving him a \$12,000 two-year maintainer to work two or three days a week at the township offices cataloguing and re-organizing bylaws as well as being available in an advisory capacity.

The Roses have a daughter, Mrs. Glenda Metrick of Toronto, and a son, Paul, who is in his final year of a liberal arts course at the University of Guelph.

Celebrations to honor the retiring senior administrative officer will begin with a reception at Eaton Hall on Dufferin Street north of King Sideroad which will be open to the public from 2:30 to 4:30 pm Saturday. This will be followed by an invitational testimonial dinner for past reeves, close associates and family.

In the evening there will be a dance for staff and friends.

Plans have been made by a special committee headed by Mayor Margaret Britnell. Others are former Mayor Kenneth Mactaggart, former Reeve Gordon Cook and former deputy-treasurer Mrs. Nell Dobson.

The job of top man in the administration of a municipality is not an easy one, points out Mrs. Britnell. Councils come and councils go, but the clerk-treasurer is responsible for keeping the municipal finances in good shape, guiding council in working within provincial statutes, debenturing, etc. It has not been the

Rapid growth of concern to Hill Ward 3 candidate

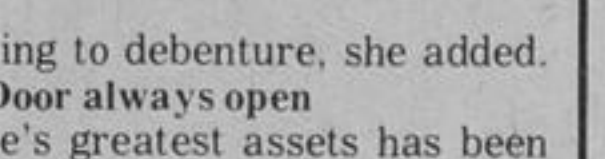
As chairman of the ratepayers he has been able to resolve long standing flooding problems in the Duncan Road area and assist residents of Briggs and Norfolk Avenues in problems with developments. In addition he was an active member of the "steering committee" which arranged the recent course on local government at Don Head Secondary School.

Participation lack
"Community awareness and participation on a personal level in local government has been generally lacking in recent years," Birchall indicated. "Through monthly councillor-public meetings of Ward 3, citizens would be afforded the opportunity to know the workings of Richmond Hill Council, what

development plans are proposed, and what their councillor is doing for them," he told "The Liberal".

Concerns with regard to preserving the David Dunlop Observatory as a research institution, maintaining community identity devoid from urban development to the south, and preservation of the Langstaff farm as open space were also voiced by Birchall.

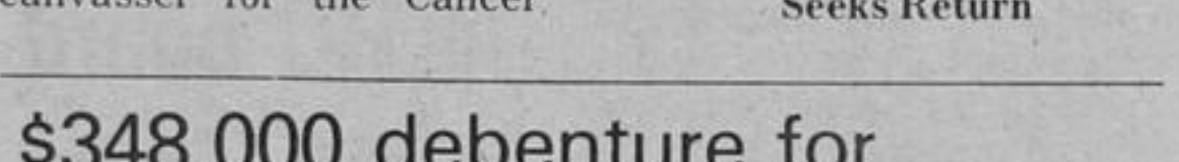
Major running in Hill Ward 3

Seeks Return

\$348,000 debenture for RC school board

The high cost of borrowing money today was evident November 5 when the York Region Roman Catholic School Board passed a bylaw authorizing debenturing for \$348,000 for the purchase of St. Peter's School site in West Woodbridge. The debentures will carry interest at 9 1/2 percent and will run for 20 years.

The total interest payments will be \$442,890 over the lifetime of the debenture, bringing the total amount of repayment to \$790,890.

It was pointed out that at the present grant rate, the province will be paying 75

percent of this amount and separate school supporters in York Region will be paying the other 25 percent.

Superintendent John Zupancic reported that there are now 274 children from the West Woodbridge area attending St. Peter's School and an additional 54 in grades 7 and 8 are accommodated at St. Margaret Mary. "By the end of 1975 present indications are that we could well have 1,000 children to be educated from that area," he said. He based his prediction on a recent survey conducted there.
