## Tribute to Frank Millman

Neighbours and friends on Spruce Avenue express their sympathy to Mrs. Gladys Millman, 50 Spruce Avenue, in the loss of her husband and to Norma and John, his daughter and son, both from out of town.

He was a well loved and respected man, kind to many, especially the children of the Richvale area. They went continually to his house to see his beautiful flower garden, taking home with them huge bouquets.

Frank had many letters and photos of the school children, whom he had known when he had caretaker of the local Richvale School, located on Spruce Avenue, several years back.

My house now stands on what was the old school yard. Frank Millman would

pop over with a few plants and seedlings (he knew literally everything about horticulture). Then he would reminisce about the good old days and how I might find, when digging in my garden, a school book or buried treasures of the local school children of past years.

Crack of dawn, in all weathers barring snowfalls, he would be up and out digging, hoeing and cultivating beautiful strains (with his own methods of cross fertilization) of tulips, daffodils, chrysanthemums, peonies, roses, ad infinitum!

Every spring, summer and fall his garden was a delight to behold! He had trees of many species — maple, fir, flowering currants and snowballs. These formed an attractive background for his wide

variety of plants and bushes with patios, facades and trellises leading up to a pretty little summer house. All this was created by the hands of one man.

He refused to let failing health hamper him in his love of the outdoors. This finally resulted in an operation in June, followed by pneumonia which finally took his life in the Green Gables Nursing Home.
