How it's done
The board's consultant, consumer services, Dorothy Batcheller, provides the recipe for the home cook:

Break one or two eggs into a moderately hot, lightly buttered frying pan. Stir egg slightly with fork or pancake turner to break yolk and mix streakily with white. Keep egg formed like a pancake to fit on a bun. Turn and cook other side.

Transfer to bottom half of hot toasted or plain hamburger bun. Top with slice of cheese, slice of tomato and remaining half of bun.
