In his testimony, Paul Bayford, 18, of Aurora, the arrested man, said he had given the police two different statements.

The first, when he was arrested, claimed Willinsky stood in the way of the policeman. The second, made several days later, refuted the statement

Willinsky testified he asked Constable Horvath for help in protecting his campaign signs, which were piled outside headquarters.

Instead Horvath swore at him and then arrested Bayford, Willinsky said. He said Horvath forced Bayford's arm up behind his back and threw him over the trunk of the cruiser.




