

Longtime resident Eric George seeks Hill regional seat

The first candidate to announce he was running for a seat as one of the two Richmond Hill regional councillor seats was Eric George of 413 North Taylor Mills Drive.

He is a professional engineer with his own consulting business. He has served the community as Ward 1 councillor, vice-president of the Ward 1 Ratepayers, as a member of home and school associations and as a volunteer fireman.

Mr. George is a member of Branch 375 of the Royal Canadian Legion, a life member of the arena association, a member of the Ontario Parks Association, the Professional Engineers

Association, the Surveying Institute of Canada, and the Pollution Control Association of Canada.

He is married and has two daughters. They have lived in this municipality for 17

years. In his platform Mr. George supports controlled growth at four percent per year, review of the zoning bylaws to remove double zonings and legalization of basement apartments.

Town hall site
He does not favor relocating the town hall to the south and wants a parking policy to aid downtown merchants. He also advocates re-examination of high rise development in BAIF, as opposed to townhouses. He wants a definite plan, policy and construction date for ditch elimination and sidewalk construction, making maximum use of senior government subsidies.

At the regional level he suggests establishing a policy of permitting existing groups such as church auxiliaries and the YWCA to operate day care centres. He also wants a public address system in the regional council chamber (where the members now sit with their backs to the public and press) so they will be audible.

Speed limits
He also believes the growth in numbers of regional employees should be controlled and economy practised to the utmost, with

capital projects deferred to times when the greatest subsidy is available.

Mr. George hopes to establish a desirable level of police protection and maintain that level. He

believes the region should establish a policy regarding

speed limits on the roads under its jurisdiction, rather

than the present patchwork system.
