


The decision of the Supreme Court of Canada in the case of Irene Murdoch, the Alberta rancher's wife, made national headlines and caused a great deal of concern among Canadians about inequalities in the law. This decision reversed one by the Supreme Court of Alberta which had ruled that Mrs. Murdoch had no equity in the ranch.

Since 1964 the Ontario Law Reform Commission been reviewing legislation and the Report on Family Property Law has now been tabled. Public reaction to proposed changes will be sought before appropriate legislation is passed, is the promise of Attorney General Robert Welch.


