we'll look at different types of deliveries. First we'll look at the curve ball. This is one of the most effective ways of getting "mixing" action amongst the pins, but is also one of the hardest to control.

To throw the curve ball is just a matter of rotating the palm of the hand inwards, from the bottom to the top of the ball during the forward swing. How do you control the curve ball?

I don't have an answer for that, and that's why I don't recommend a curve ball for a beginner. The ball is effective - when it hits the target. But with all the spin it has, it's very difficult to hit the target with any degree of consistency. A slight change in speed of delivery can cause a large change in the size of curve. 




