NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION TO THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL for approval of a by-law to regulate land use passed pursuant to Section 35 of the Planning Act.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act for approval of By-law No. 63-74 passed on the 10th day of October 1974. A copy of the by-law is furnished herewith. A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSONS INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DAY FOR filing objections will be the 27th day of December, 1974.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL

BY-LAW NO. 63-74

A By-law to Amend By-law No. 39-71 as Amended of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill.

WHEREAS the matters herein set out are in conformity with the Official Plan of Richmond Hill which is approved and in force at this time.

AND WHEREAS there has been no amendment to the Official Plan of the Town of Richmond Hill proposed by the Council but not approved at this time with which the matters set out are not in conformity.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:

1. That By-law No. 39-71 of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill as amended, be and is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph to Section 7.6 as thereof: "7.6.1.1 (a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this By-law a gas bar may be erected and maintained on that parcel of land being Block N, Plan M-1436.

READ A FIRST AND SECOND TIME THIS 29th DAY OF JULY 1974.

READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED THIS 10th DAY OF OCTOBER 1974.

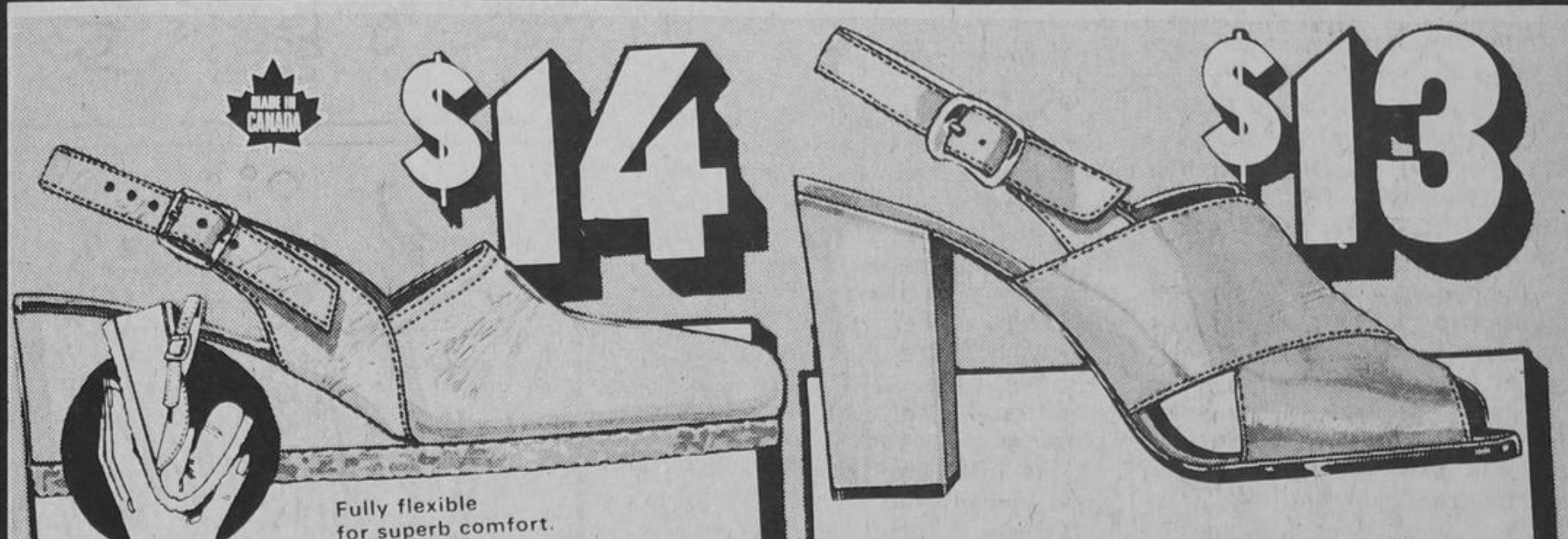

EXPLANATORY NOTE

BY-LAW NO. 63-74

By-law 63-74 affects Block N, Plan M-1436 located on the north side of Carrville Road adjacent to the Simpsons-Sears store in the Hillcrest Mall. The lands are zoned District Commercial by By-law number 39-71 which permits certain commercial uses. The purpose of By-law number 63-74 is to permit the operation of a gas bar in addition to these uses.

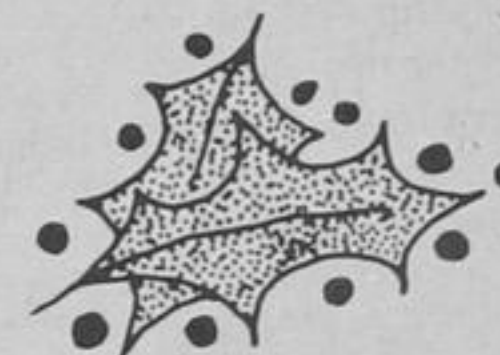
