But a small group of devotees in Maple are not worried about the relative obscurity of this pastime. They just play for fun.

The Maple Badminton Club is now four years old and has about 20 members. They meet each Tuesday evening at the George Bailey Public School for a few sets.

Like many other activities around Maple that make residents there proud of their little piece of heaven, the club was started by the Maple Area Recreation Committee. It is now under the wing of the Vaughan Recreation Department and is kept running from week to week by the one-woman executive Joan Lines of 31 Lancer Drive.

Membership costs \$6 a year for a season that lasts from October to April. Activities have now been suspended for the Christmas holidays but will recommence January 7.

Though most members are in the 40s age group, the club is open to anyone over the age of 16 and there are a few young people who are now members. The club has room for a few more members, but not many because there are only two courts in the school.

Most evenings, play is distinctly uncompetitive. "Everyone goes for a night out and some exercise," said Mrs. Line. "We get a good workout."

But twice a year they hold a round robin competition to separate the lobbies from the slammers. On December 10, a good turnout of 16 members enjoyed the evening with Mary Norcliffe taking home first prize. Marilyn Ireland was second and Rina Dierx took home the low score prize. Fred Bourke, of Grand

Street, Maple, who once coached new players for the club, organized the tournament.

Those people who want to just try out the game can join the club for an evening. It only costs 50 cents. Hours are from 8 to 10 p.m. You need your own racket but the club supplies the birds.
