

# Undefeated Alliance Juves win 3 more

If the Richmond Hill Alliance Sports Juveniles get any better in the New Year they will be impressive. The reason is simple. They added three more notches to their win-belt last week to bring their 1974 win-

loss-tie record to 19-0-1. That's no losses, n-o losses. Their latest victory came Wednesday night of last week when they outscored Aurora 5-3 but had to hang on after taking an early 3-0 lead.

Leading the way to the lead with the goals were Richard Hopson, Bob McCullough and Mike Wood with assists going to Bob Russell, two, John Oakley, Jeff Miller and Mike Wood. Aurora closed the gap in the latter part of the second with Manney Wolf picking

up two goals both assisted by Blake Fitzsimons. Scott Davey got the third period underway for Alliance with a goal on a solo effort only to have Mike Caruso of Aurora put his team back into contention with a well-placed shot assisted by Manney Wolf. There was only one and a half minutes left in the game when the determined Richmond Hill club picked up its insurance goal. Mike Woods got it from Richard Hopson. Aurora came close to upsetting the Hill's streak as they had a two-man advantage at times in the final period but failed to capitalize. The last three minutes of the match was all Alliance Sports as they controlled the puck while playing two men short for four minutes and only giving up one goal.
