

Richvale Juves edge London team by 4-2 Ken Ablett gets winner

Richvale Hillcrest Mall Juveniles travelled to London January 4 to beat a tenacious Stoneybrook team 4-2 in OMHA action. Stoneybrook opened the scoring in the first and that goal was unanswered until the second when Bob Mills tipped in a pass from Dave Hartwick.
