December. Another important feature of this evening's meeting will be a presentation by Dr. John Blakely, chief of medicine and director of coronary care at York Central.

Dr. Blakely is also a research fellow and consultant at the coronary care unit at Sunnybrook Hospital and an assistant professor in the faculty of medicine at the University of Toronto. He will describe the new coronary care unit and how it operates.

Flying start The auxiliary is already off to a flying start in its aim to raise even more money this year. Tickets for its Pub Night next week are sold

A candlelight and wine party is scheduled for March 19 and there will be fashion shows in one of the hospital's lecture rooms April 15 and 16.

This year's White Rose dinner dance will take place May 10 at the new Prince Hotel, and the new gift shop - twice as large, serving twice as many visitors to twice as many patients - is expected to net twice as much in profit.

When renovations to the original hospital building are completed this year there will be more patients moving in and more services to provide and more equipment to buy. The auxiliary intends to be prepared.
