
Norm Stephenson was part of history in German Mills, Richmond Hill area

A lifelong resident of Richmond Hill, Norman Stephenson, passed away early in the morning February 3 after an illness of some months. He contributed much to the community in which he lived.

He was among those whose services to the town were recognized at the town's annual awards dinner held in November Mayor William Lazenby paid tribute to Stephenson's work for the towr, as a fenceviewer for many years and as a dedicated worker during Richmond Hill's Centennial Year in 1973.

The eldest son of Richard and Gertrude Stephenson, who were also lifelong residents of Richmond Hill and district, Norman received his education at Headford, German Mills and Richmond Hill schools.


