**Public school board not changing name**

York County Board of Education will remain just that. For the time being, anyway.

That was the decision of the board Monday night in a close 9-8 vote on a motion calling for the chairman's committee to write to the ministry of education.

The motion would have asked the ministry to take appropriate legislative action to change the name of the board to "The Board of Education for the Regional Municipality of York, or The York Region Board of Education, whichever the ministry prefers."

The motion was presented by Trustee John Stephens of Markham, and seconded by Colin Barrett of Vaughan. Stephens said he thought it was "time we brought the board up to date. If we're going to have a region, it's time we used the Region of York."

In response to critics of the cost of changeover, Stephens said it could be done "easily enough. We don't have to do it all at once."

It was time the board "stopped dealing with a non-existent municipality and started dealing with the

facts of life." A motion to table the motion Trustee Doreen Quirk of Markham was lost 10-9.

Trustee John Raniowski of

Schomberg, said there was "nothing wrong" with the present name. The board had existed before the region and "there was nothing wrong in advertising it."

Another motion to refer it to the committee studying the P. S. Ross Report on the study of management and the administrative structure, was also lost.

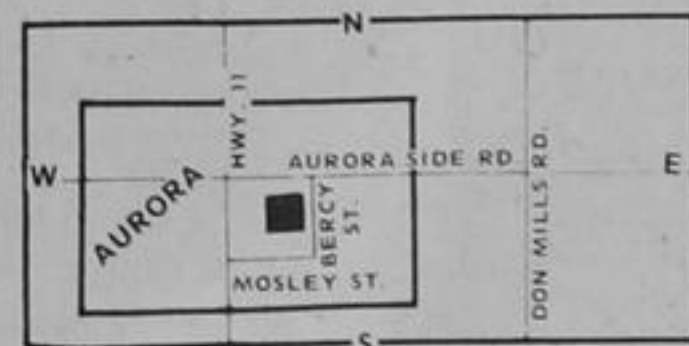

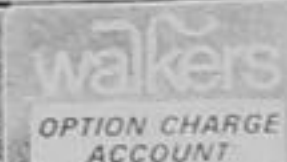
