IT PAYS TO READ THE FINE PRINT!

Misbehavior is merely a means of trying to attain one's goals

Ways to determine the direction of individual goals was the essence of Dr. Stan Shapiro's recent address to local citizens at the Hillcrest Auditorium. Dr. Shapiro, a noted lecturer at the Adler Institute, Toronto, was introduced by John Stephenson of the Richmond Hill and Thornhill Family Services, sponsors of the series of lectures.
Dr. Shapiro said a child misbehaves not because he's bad.
It is usually because this is the only way he can find recognition or power in the family.
Dr. Shapiro made it clear

we are all individuals, even within our own family circle and have to be understood according to our personality differences.
The oldest child tends to be jealous because he loses his sole territorial rights when another child is born.
The third child aligns with the oldest and may try to imitate whilst the youngest looks for the same attention as the first and will be his rival and may buddy with the second.
In a three-child family, the middle one tends to be squeezed out by the other two, the older having privileges, the younger getting his own way — the

result is the middle child feels cheated.
Now, a good child in the family, always receiving lots of praise, may reverse his position and appear bad, his school marks decline and he becomes careless, etc.
The cause is he probably got too much abnormal attention at the beginning, an amount which can not be maintained throughout his growth and development.
Dr. Shapiro referred to Rudolf Dreikler's book, "Children, the Challenge," in which he explains the dynamics of avoiding extreme misbehavior patterns.
As a member of the Adlerian Society himself,

Dr. Shapiro pointed out Alfred Adler's theory on the differences of behavior in its social content in relation to others around a person.
The small child underfoot at all times — the poor eater — are both typical examples of attention seekers for which he emphasized various ways of diagnosis to help us understand the bossy, the revengeful or just the "playing helpless" type of child.
These actions, when respected by parent or teacher, should enable the child to cope with his own inner struggles in his growing-up process.

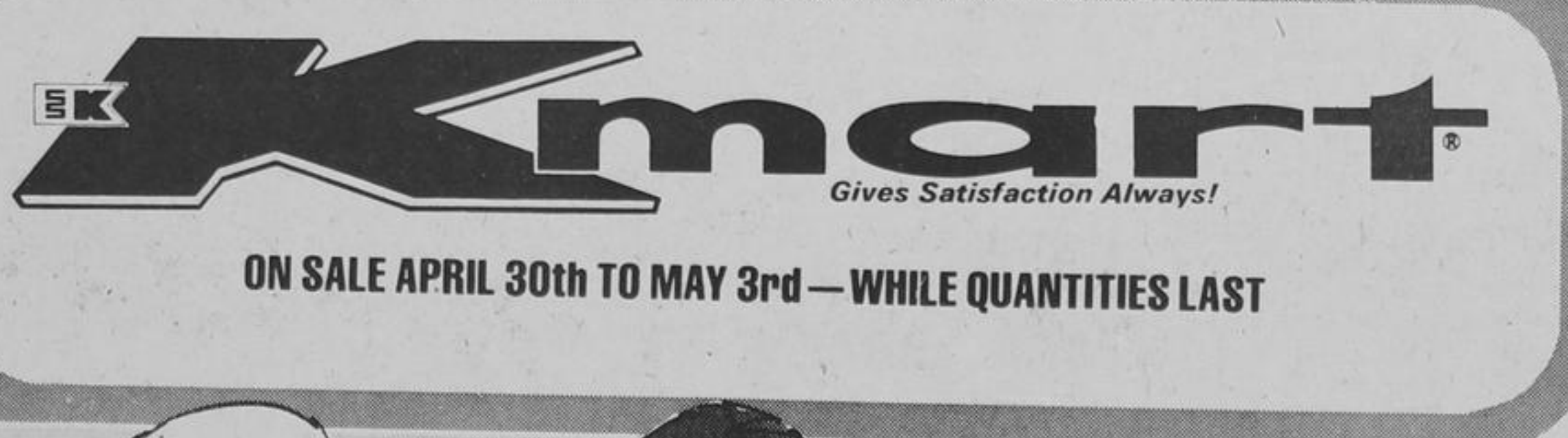
