At the Headquarters Tract of York Regional Forest on the east side of Hwy. 48, two miles north of Ballantrae. (Ballantrae is at the intersection of the Aurora sideroad and Hwy. 48). The correct entrance will be marked by a green "FOREST WALK" sign.

This is a special forest walk to observe Canada's National Forest Week. The full walk will be 3 miles and take two hours. Shorter walks will be available for those who do not want to go the full distance.

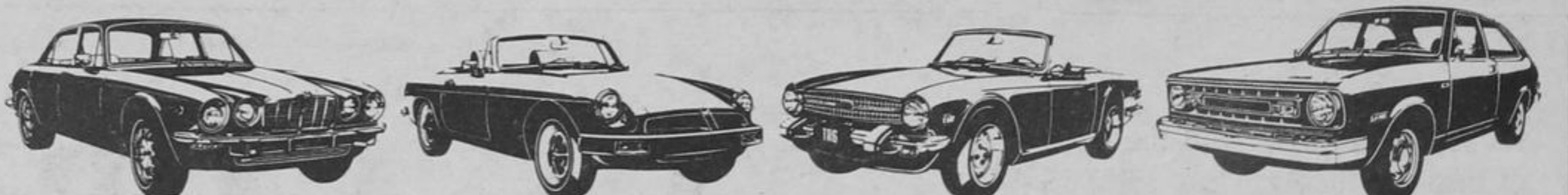
