1 pint (1/2 pound) mushrooms 1 10-ounce bag fresh spinach 2 tablespoons cooking oil or butter

1/2 teaspoon salt Black Pepper to taste Dash cayenne pepper (careful here!)

12 5-inch crepes (very thin storage, in the freezer. pancakes, cooked) Parmesan cheese

Wipe mushrooms with a damp cloth and trim off dried stem end. Chop finely. In a large skillet saute mushrooms in oil or butter over moderate heat, about five minutes.

Meantime wash spinach leaves, cook in water clinging to leaves in a tightly covered pot. Drain well, chop finely.

Combine mushrooms and spinach. Season to taste. Carefully add a teaspoon or two of cream, just enough

to bind the mushroom

mixture. Divide the mixture roughly into 12 equal portions. Spread each portion over one third of each pancake or crepe. Roll up and place seam side down in a shallow oven proof dish.


