YRP pay up

An across-the-board salary increase of 16.5 percent for 1975 has been accepted by the uniformed York Region Police. No settlement has been worked out yet between the police commission and its civilian employees. Another benefit agreed upon was an extension of the lunch period from 45 minutes to 60 minutes, although 15 minutes of this time must be spent writing any necessary reports. Overtime can now be paid in cash or time off. However, if there is still cash or time off owing on June 30, September 30, or December 31, a lump sum payment will be made in cash. Under the new agreement, any officer who obtains an average of 80 percent at police college will be entitled to a promotion of two months towards his next classification. An improved drug plan has also been approved for the force - 100 percent of the cost of drugs will now be paid. Previously, 80 percent was covered, with \$25 deductible. The cleaning allowance has been increased from \$60 to \$70 a year. According to the terms of the agreement, the officers will earn as follows: - 1st Class Constable: 1974, \$13,500; 1975, \$15,727; - Sergeant: 1974, \$15,000; 1975, \$17,591; - Detective: 1974, \$15,000; 1975, \$17,591; - Staff Sergeant: 1974, \$16,175; 1975, \$18,843; - Detective Sergeant: 1974, \$16,175; 1975, \$18,843; - Inspector: 1974, \$18,000; 1975, \$20,970; - Staff Inspector: 1974, \$19,750; 1975, \$23,800.

Antique treat aids Girl Guides

Richmond Hill antique buffs were treated to a unique experience when one of this country's foremost Canadiana experts Donald Webster, spoke on 19th Century English-Canadian crafted furniture. The lecture, sponsored by the Richmond Hill West District Association of the Girl Guides of Canada, was held in the Blue Flame Room in the Consumer's Gas Co.'s offices on Elgin Mills Road. Professor Webster is curator of the Canadiana department of the Royal Ontario Museum, and also teaches history of art at the University of Toronto. His discussion focussed on the finely hand-crafted furniture of the period between 1800 and 1870. His presentation included a selection of slides to describe methods of cabinet-making, types of woods used, and the historical background of the featured pieces. The furniture illustrated included such diverse items as sideboards, chairs, tables, clocks, corner cupboards and sofas, and culminated with an elaborately and magnificently carved piano. One of the highlights of the program was a question and answer period that centered on methods of refinishing and preservation of privately owned pieces of Canadiana. Bernice McCartney, who introduced the speaker, said approximately 200 people had attended. Funds raised will be used primarily to finance summer camps and provide equipment for Guides and Brownies. Barbara Pfenning, who retired last year as a Guide leader and as district Guide, thanked Mr. Webster for his talk. Cecily Thomson, commissioner for public relations for the National Committee of Guides, provided a display of early Guide and Brownie uniforms. Flowers for the occasion were arranged by Flavia Redelmeier, who is also a member of the board of the museum. Cookies were baked and served by the ladies of the association.
