

In continuing efforts to maintain and extend marriage and family counselling services, the four Family Life Centres in York Region are preparing to launch their third training program for volunteer lay

For the past two years a program for selection, training and supervision of counsellors has been offered by the centres in Richmond Hill, Markham, Newmarket and Georgina in cooperation with Seneca

counsellors.

A selection conference will be held June 7 for the purpose of selecting a limited number of people to be received into the program for 1975-76, reports Dr. Frank Fidler, director of the Richmond Hill-Thornhill


