

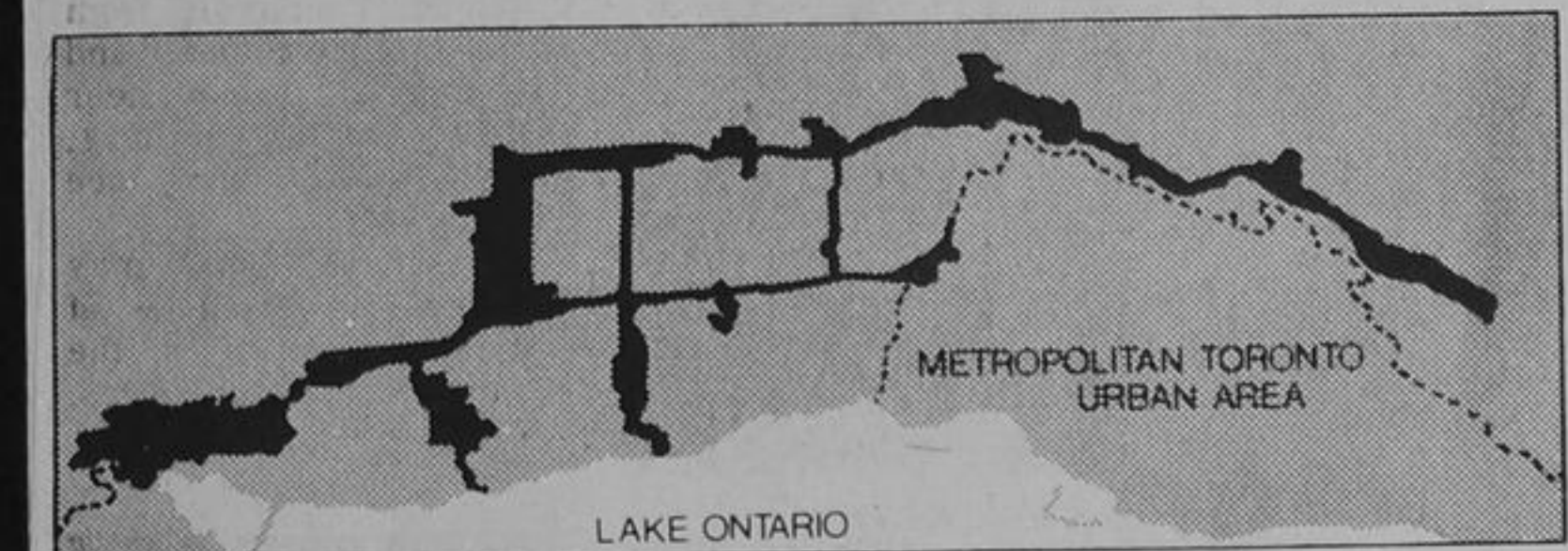

Woodland walks

Experienced naturalists will be acting as guides for special woodland walks at seven Metro Conservation Areas Sunday. These nature hikes in a wildlife setting will provide opportunities for family outings in some of the most beautiful outdoor settings in the area. Walks start at 10:30 am and 2 pm at Boyd (north of Woodbridge on Islington Avenue North) and Bruce's Mill (two miles east of Don Mills Road on the Gormley-Stouffville Sideroad); at 2 pm at Claremont (two miles east of Brougham on Highway 7 and one and a quarter miles north on the Westney Road); also at Albion Hills, Cold Creek and GlenHaffy at 10:30 am and 2 pm, and at Greenwood at 10:30 am only. Region family services is launching its third volunteer training program

In continuing efforts to maintain and extend marriage and family counselling services, the four Family Life Centres in York Region are preparing to launch their third training program for volunteer lay counsellors.

For the past two years a program for selection, training and supervision of counsellors has been offered by the centres in Richmond Hill, Markham, Newmarket and Georgina in co-operation with Seneca College.

A selection conference will be held June 7 for the purpose of selecting a limited number of people to be received into the program for 1975-76, reports Dr. Frank Fidler, director of the Richmond Hill-Thornhill centre.

Interested persons should contact one of the four centres before May 31, however, to allow time for formal applications and interviews prior to the conference.

Can contribute
Experience in York and elsewhere has shown mature men and women with appropriate skills and characteristics can significantly enrich counselling programs. They must be willing and able to give the equivalent of about one day a week (daytime and/or evenings) for 40 weeks a year in training and service activities.

Three 12-week courses will be offered at Seneca College King Campus one evening a week in the fall, winter and spring.

The subjects are developmental psychology (from birth to death), the counselling role, and marriage and sexuality.

Under supervision
Trainees will also be involved with counselling in the centres under supervision of experienced professional counsellors as

they progress in these courses. Those completing a three-year program will be awarded a certificate by Seneca.

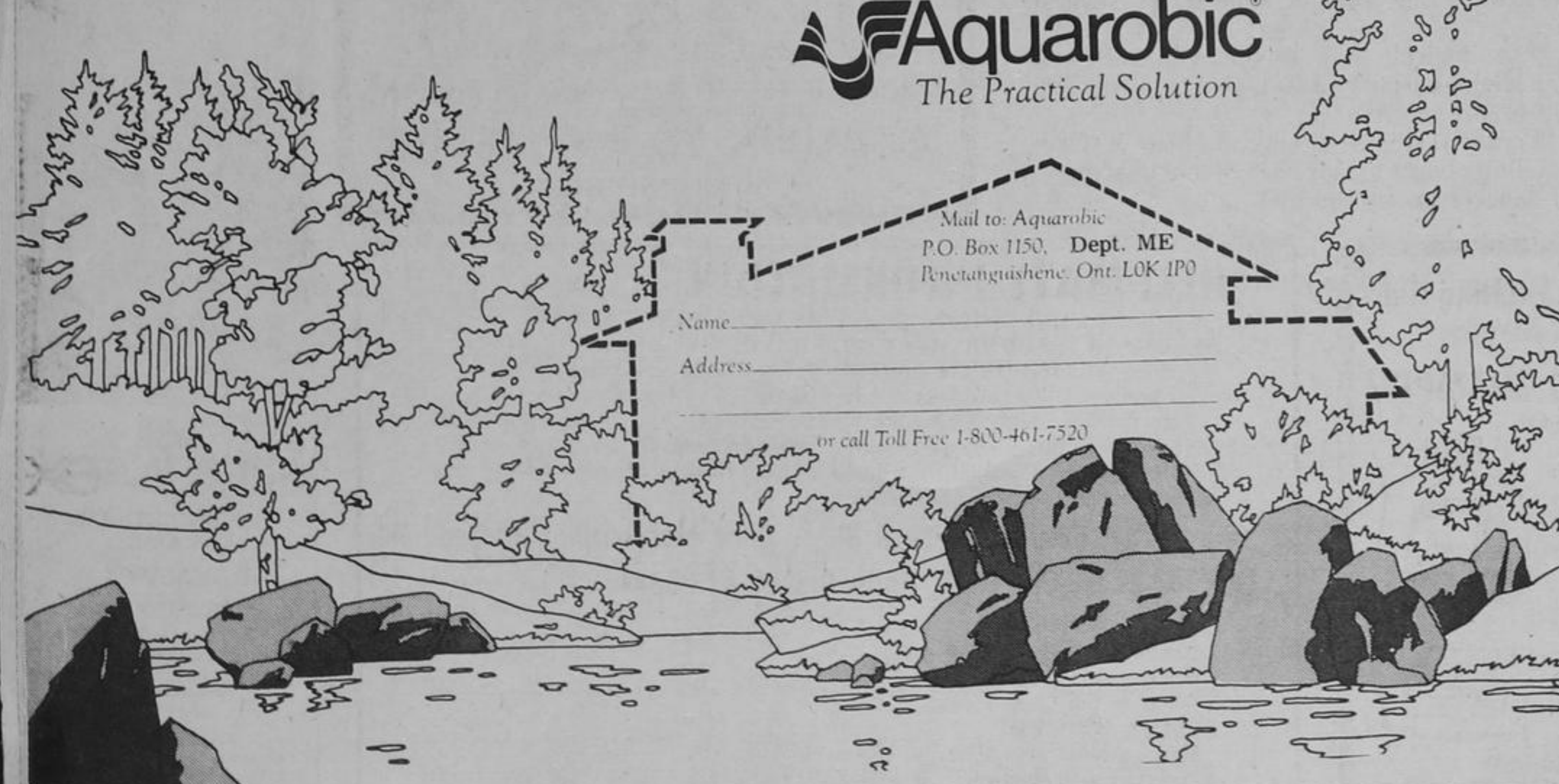
