She studied and taught at the University of Toronto before moving to Humber College where she now teaches in the faculty of food services.

Mrs. Gryfe discussed the importance of selecting one food in each group from Canada's Food Guide for each and every meal.

These four groups are: milk (including cheese, yogurt, ice cream); meat (including fish, poultry, eggs, dried beans and peas and nuts); fruit and vegetables; and bread (including cereals).

She pointed out everybody needs about 1,500 calories each day just to stay alive. If a person is active they need more.

If you're interested in losing weight cut down on fat and carbohydrates and step up your energy but don't cut out vitamins, minerals and protein.

She added that even if you are on a special diet (for instance, heart disease or high blood pressure) you would still plan your menu and Castle Rock Crescent. according to the four food Congratulations

Peanut butter or cheese on crackers, yogurt, raisins, fruit or raw vegetables, cold cuts, a hard-boiled egg or . . . popcorn.


