

### Pavilion Novgorod featured performer

Maria Bachlowa of Wilcox Lake, will be the featured performer at the Pavilion Novgorod during the annual Toronto Caravan to be held June 22 to July 1.

Mrs. Bachlowa is a contralto soloist and will be singing with a balalaika group in the Soviet pavilion which will also offer Russian food including cabbage rolls, herring and vodka.

The pavilion is located at Watt and Kersdale Streets in the Keele-Rogers Road area.

As a young girl in Russia Mrs. Bachlowa sang on radio programs. Then came the black days of World War 11 and she spent two years in a prison camp in Germany.

Surviving that dreadful time, which took so many

lives, she decided to emigrate to Canada 25 years ago and has found it a land of opportunity if one is willing to work.

She is now a widow and has raised a family of five children. Twenty-four of those years have been spent at Lake Wilcox.

She is a former employee of Ratcliffs (Canada) Ltd., Richmond Hill.

### Resumed career

Almost three years ago she decided to take up her career as a singer where it had been interrupted.

She has studied with Mrs. Eugenia Asmas, member of the Canadian Federation of Music Teachers Association.

Since then she has sung in Detroit, at the Lester B. Pearson Memorial Hall, Highway 7 at Dixie

Road, and at the Harmony Club in Toronto with great success.

All these appearances being given free to aid in raising money for various projects.

Now she is looking forward to making recordings and presenting concerts throughout this area, with an appearance at Ontario Place being negotiated.

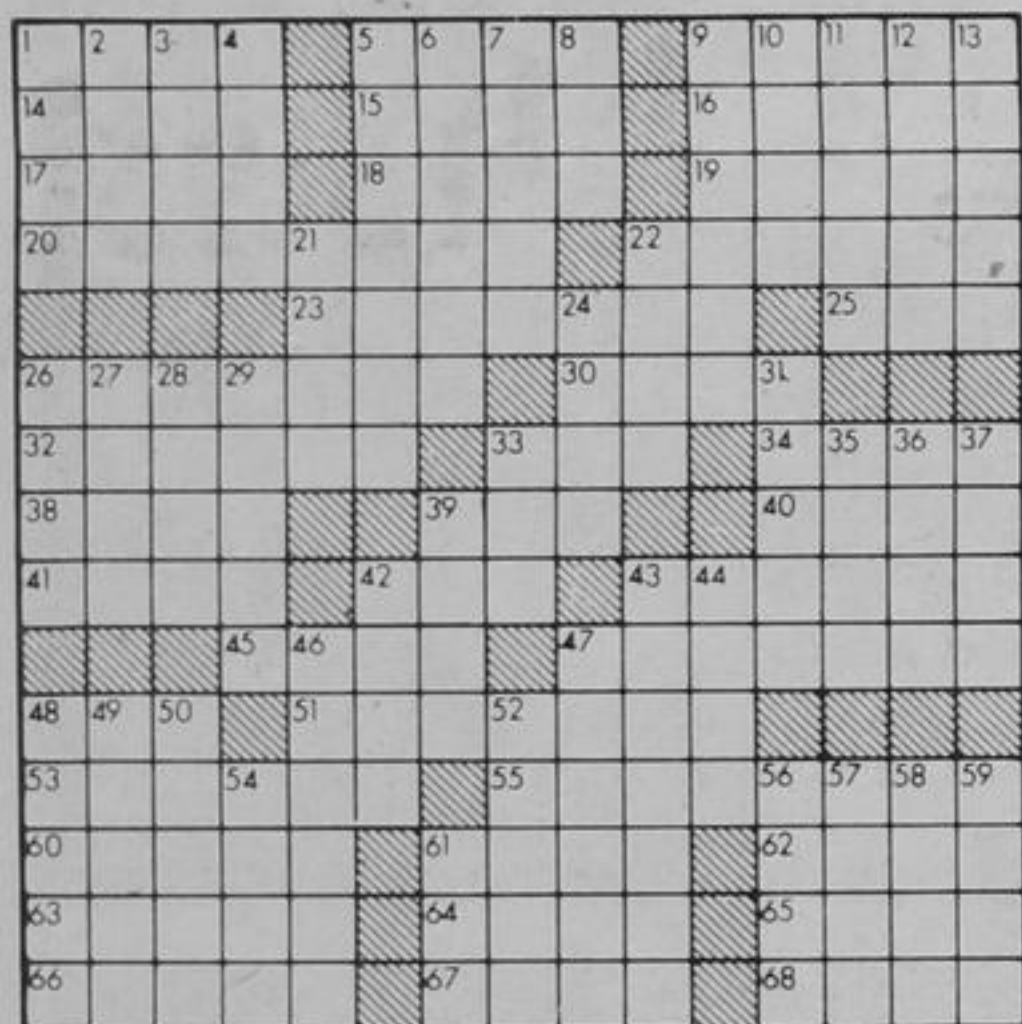

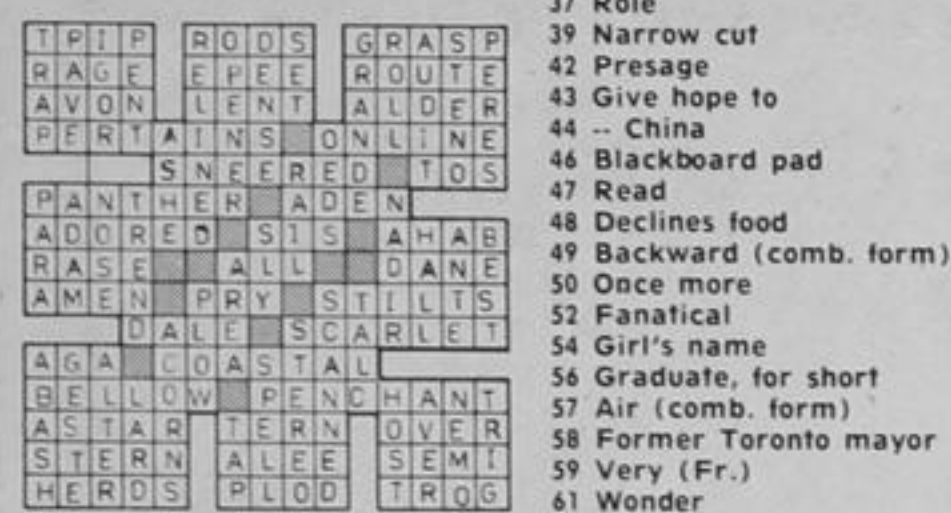

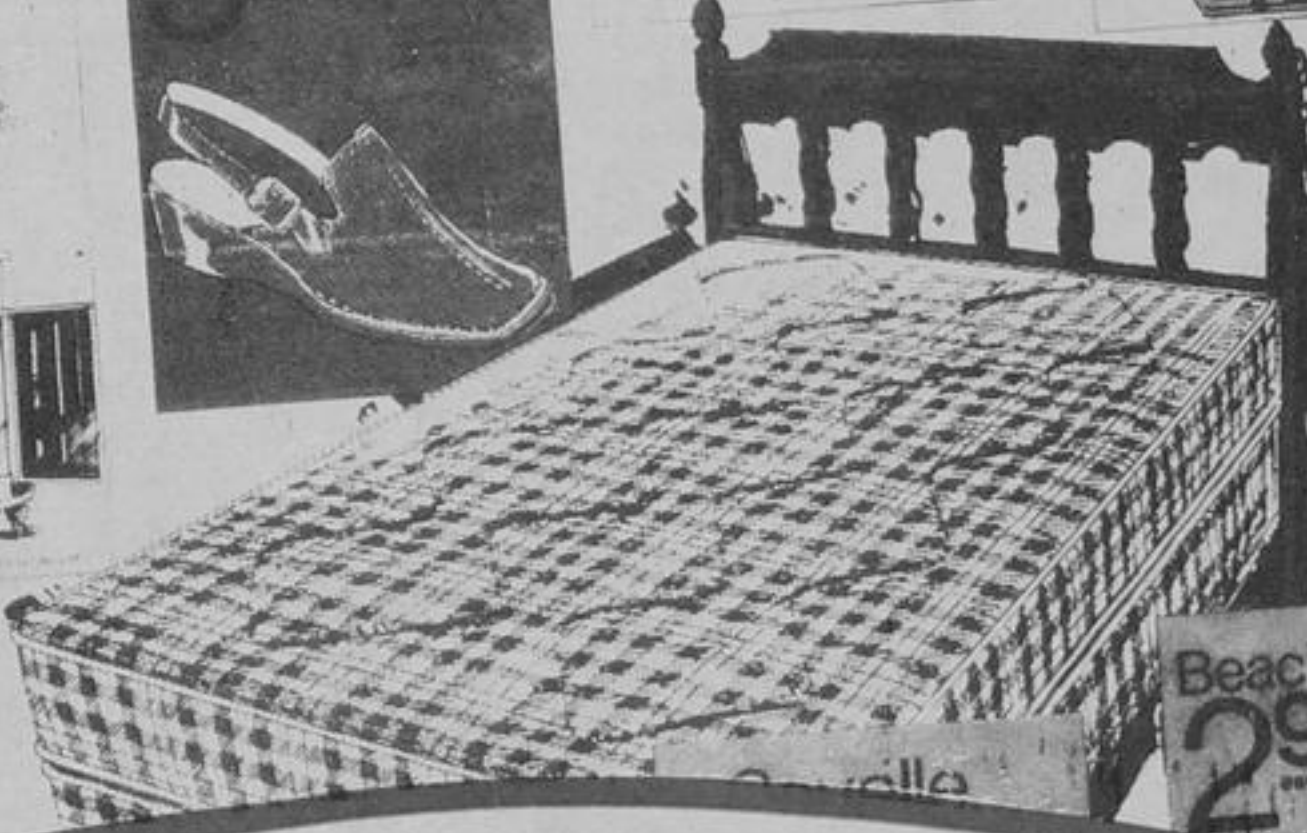
