Spensely accounted for four runs-batted-in, Inch two, with Zurich, Wood and Griffith earning a single rbi. Spensely scored three runs, Wood and

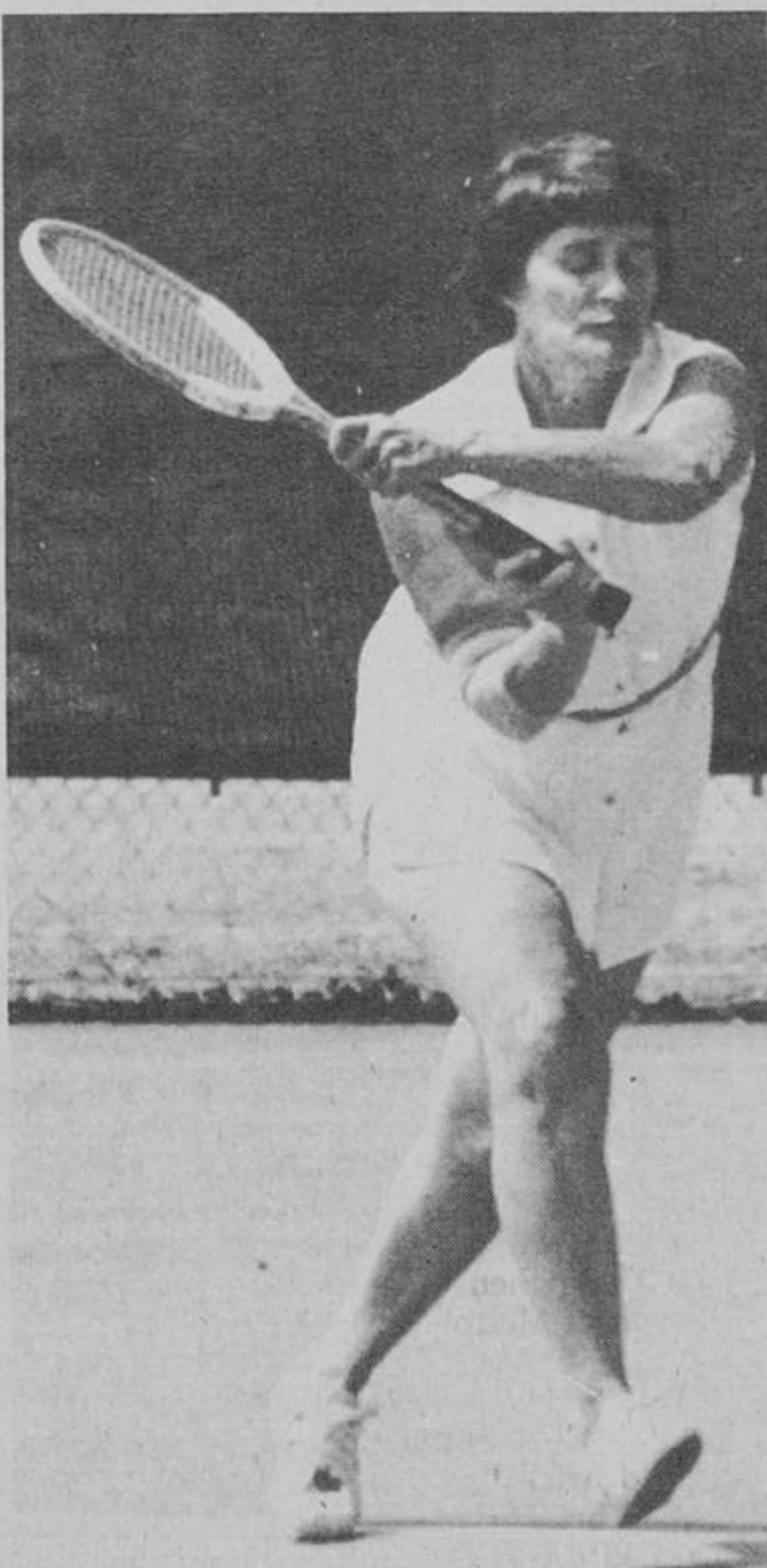
Griffith two, with single runs scored by Zurich, Steve Madden, Walton and Inch.

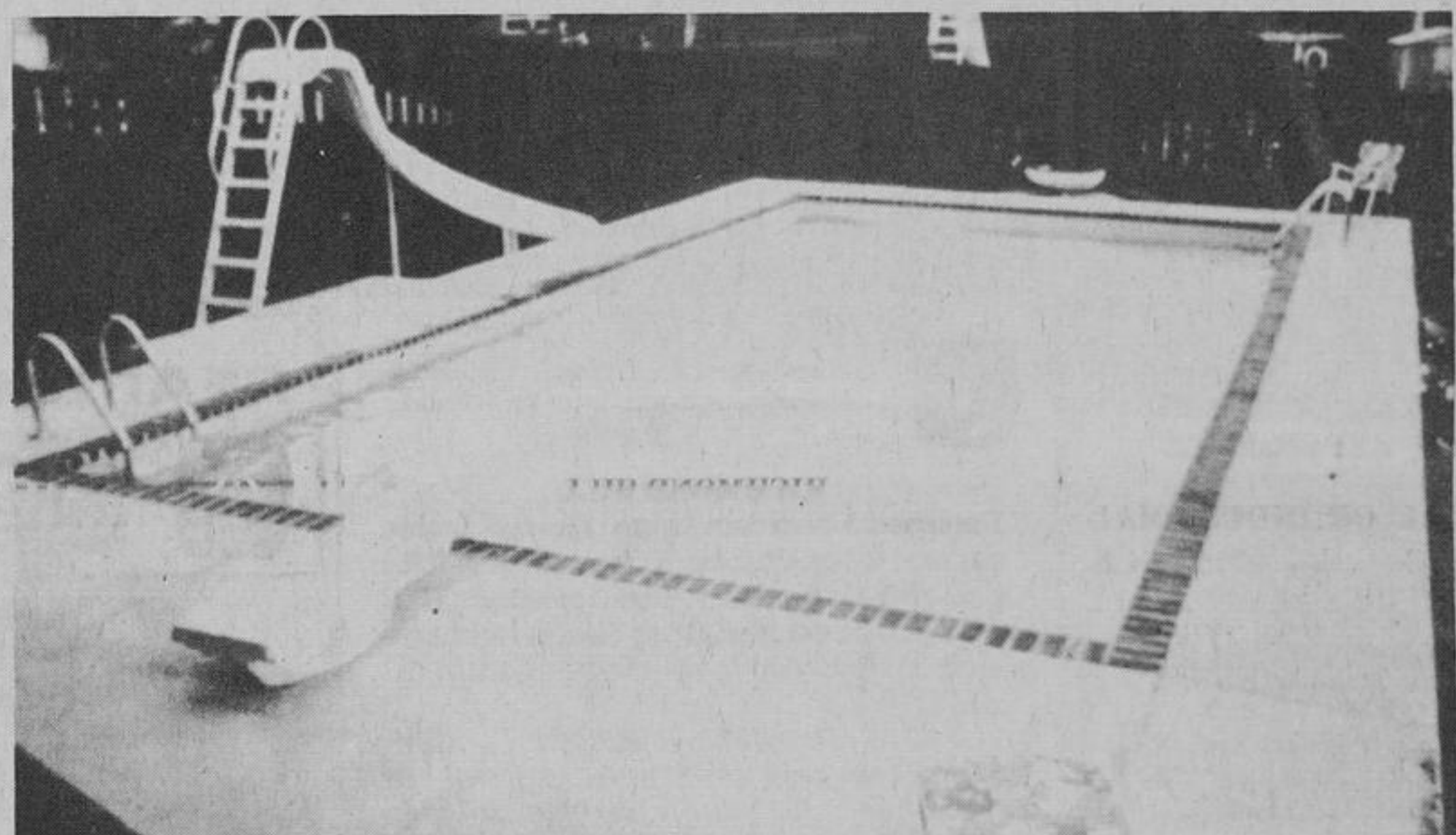

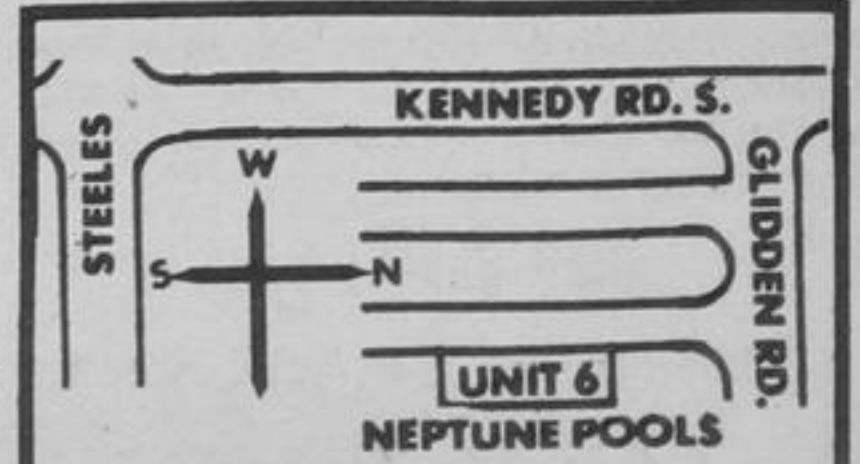

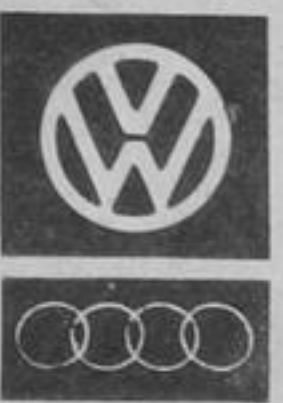
