Many fledgling astronomers were inspired last week at the Dunlop Observatory's Open House.

After Dr. Tom Bolton's interesting talk, the audience was invited to ask questions.

"Black holes" sparked off quite a bit of interest, especially among the younger audience present in the capacity-filled room.

Dr. Bolton also explained the problem of lighting and how it can interfere with viewing the stars.

By dimming plaza lights and having the beams shine down on the ground, much of these problems can be avoided.

The 74" telescope was there for everyone to look through.

It is the largest telescope in the world through which the public is allowed to look and the moon looked almost a stone's throw away when viewed that way!

The smaller 24" telescope was also open to the public.

All the staff were very helpful in demonstrating equipment and patiently answering questions.

A new star had been sighted at the observatory over the Labor Day weekend, which made for an exciting event.

There were many other telescopes dotted over the observatory grounds with both adults and children

waiting to have a look at the moon, stars and planets, as well as having interesting conversations with the astronomers.

The Open House was sponsored by both the Observatory and Richmond Hill parks and recreation department and certainly gave the public a better insight on the role of Observatory plays.
