Toronto man found not guilty murder

Howard Daniel Dean, 39, of Toronto, has been found not guilty of murdering Jack Raymond Richardson, 43, whose bullet-ridden body was found near a deserted barn close to Highway 7 and Kirby Sideroad in the Town of Vaughan last March.

The verdict was delivered by a Supreme Court jury of eight men and four women, after a 12-day trial before Mr. Justice O'Driscoll.

Dean still awaits trial on a charge of conspiring with Louis Stavroff, 48, to murder 41-year-old Vincent Giorlando. Stavroff, a moneylender, testified he had lent Giorlando \$5,000 so that he could take up the business as well.
