## No Gamble change

Numerous ratepayers from the Gamble Sideroad-Rothbury Road-Colesbrook Road area in north Richmond Hill were present at the October 8 meeting of the planning committee of town Council, to hear the final chapter in the application of J.R. Ashton for an amendment to Bylaw 2523 to permit severance of Lot 13, Plan 4667.

Bylaw 2523 restricts each subdivision lot to one residence in its Section 5 (26). The committee decided that no change should be made in the bylaw.

A staff report pointed out that even if a general amendment were made to the bylaw only lots that complied with the minimum frontage of 150 feet and minimum area of one acre could be severed, and only five lots in the subdivision could qualify. The subdivision lots are three acres in size.

In response to a questionnaire circulated to the 32 lot owners, many had expressed the opinion that any change in the bylaw should be applicable to all lots.

## Want curls Wyndhurst Gate

A petition signed by the four property owners on Wyndhurst Gate asking for the installation of curbs on a local improvement basis was presented to Richmond Hill Council October 6 by Giles Verkuyl. The petition set forth the limits of the annual amount the ratepayers were willing to pay for this work.

Verkuyl told council that storm sewers have been put in on the street and

that he was given to understand by the contractor that the ditch in front of his property would be filled in. "Instead it has been deepened and mine is the only one of the four properties with a ditch. Curbs are necessary if the catch basins are to carry away the water.

The petition was referred to the engineering department for investigation and establishment of cost.
