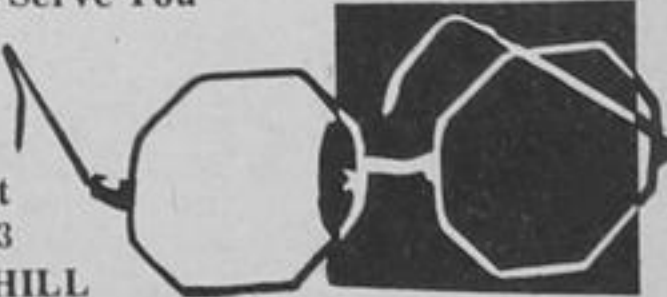

Delay action

Action on Amendment 9 to the Richmond Hill Official Plan was deferred by council Monday night until a report on the suitability of the land for agriculture is heard from the recently appointed rural land use consultative committee.

The rural land use consultative committee, named by Mayor David Schiller, is composed of Eric Baker and Ernest Redelmeier. However, Councillor Andy Chateaubert reported that the latter had told him he was resigning from the committee. The mayor agreed but said Redelmeier would continue to help the committee in a consultative capacity.

Return control to arena board

Administration of the community rooms in the arenas will be returned to the arena board, Richmond Hill Council decided on a 5-4 vote Monday night. This will entail handing bookings and assuming the costs of maintenance and debenturing. Councillor Al Duffy, chairman of the parks and recreation committee reported.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act for approval of By-law 110-75 passed on the 18th day of August, 1975. A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished below.

ANY PERSONS INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSONS wishing to approve of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for a hearing that may be held with notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law before doing so if it may appear a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DAY FOR FILING objections will be the 5th day of November, 1975.

AND WHEREAS there has been no amendment to the Richmond Hill Official Plan proposed by the Council but not approved at this time with which the matters herein set out are not in conformity.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:

1. That By-law No. 66-71 as amended be and is hereby amended by deleting the words and figures, "fifty feet (50 ft.) distance" from Section 4.1.3. FENCES AND HEDGES and by substituting therefore the words and figures "thirty feet (30 ft.) distant" and by adding to that section the following:

"For the purpose of this paragraph a one foot (1') reserve abutting a street line shall be deemed to be a street line."

READ A SECOND TIME THIS 18th DAY OF August 1975.

READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED THIS 18th DAY OF August 1975.
