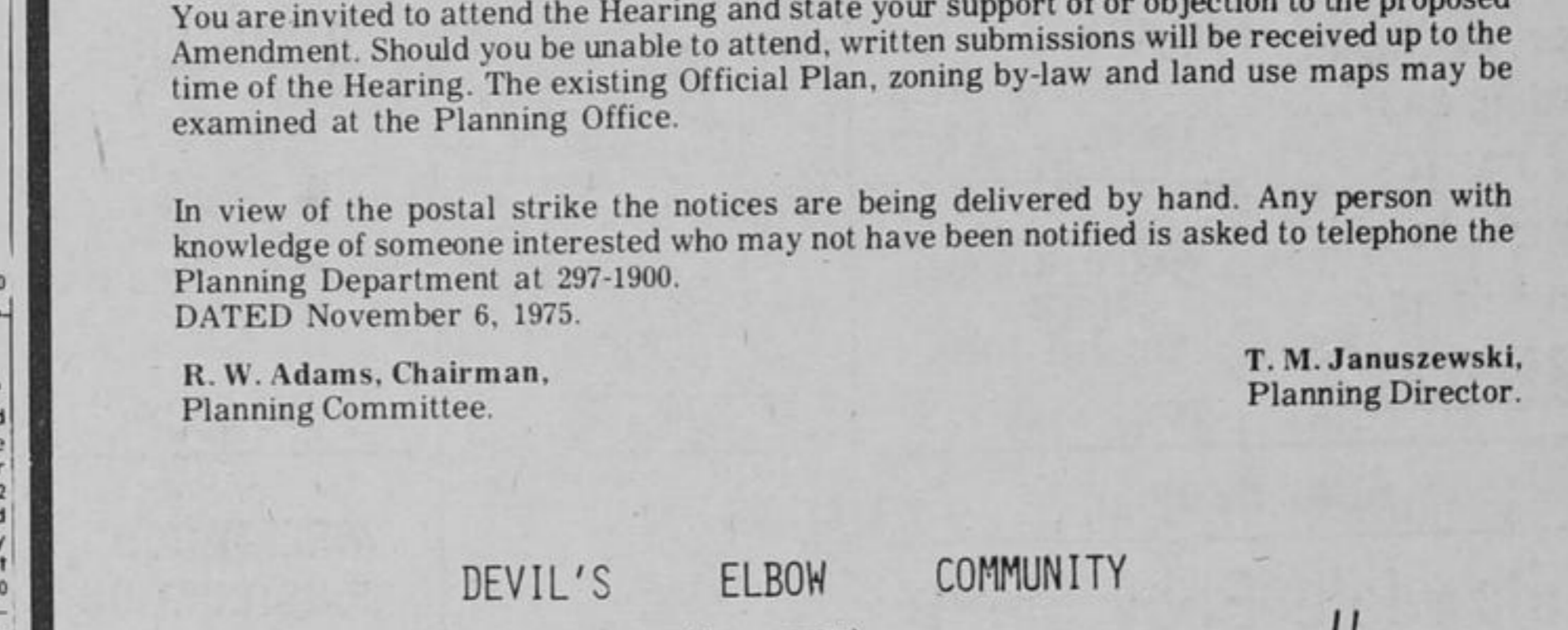

Planning Committee of the Town of Markham will hold a Public Hearing in the Council Chambers at the Municipal Offices in Buttonville to consider an Amendment to the existing Official Plan for the Devil's Elbow Community. The purpose of this proposed Amendment is to change the designations on the applicant's land (see map below) from Private Open Space and Neighbourhood Parks to Residential Single Family. The applicant, R. Person Realty Ltd., also requests that the existing Official Plan be further amended to reduce the requirement for minimum 2 acre lots to 1 acre. This is in order that it may be permitted to develop its lands which are presently occupied by the Buttonwood Golf Course and some additional lands, with approximately 58 single family lots, each with a minimum area of 1 acre. The subject property is located in part of Lots 19 and 20, Concession 4. You are invited to attend the Hearing and state your support or objection to the proposed Amendment.
