From Milan to San Francisco

This group of new ones has a distinctly international flavour. Next Saturday in Milan, by Warren Tute George Mado, the dashing hero of Warren Tute's series of superior spy thrillers, is thrust this time into a boiling broth of plots and counterplots brewed up by the KGB, CIA, MI5, the Mafia and the Palestinian terrorists — cooks from every secret and terrorist organization now active in international espionage. His mission: to find out somehow, at any cost to his personal safety, from a Greek millionaire, a Palestinian leader, an Arab sheik, a frosty Russian officer and their attendant delectable women, where and when the next peace-shattering political coup will take place. Jacqueline, By R. Galella
This detailed account of an odd compulsion to follow and photograph Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis seethes with snapshots of Jackie, her children, her husbands, and all the glamorous bit players in her life. It represents a tour de force by the obsessed photographer who assembled and published his unique collection only after a lengthy period of litigation and legal harassment. For all those Jacqueline Kennedy fans who never get enough. (Non-fiction)

Great Cartoons of the World, edited by John Bailey
Here is a large selection from the work of the best joke cartoonists publishing their humor in newspapers and periodicals all over the world. Even the iron curtain is occasionally disturbed by ripples of laughter. If your week could do with a light-hearted half-hour, come in and get this book off the shelves. (Non-fiction)

Fatu-Hiva — Back to Nature, by Thor Heyerdahl
The author and his young wife needed dauntless courage to spend the year 1936 on the wild Marquesas Islands. There the seeds were sown which produced in later years Kon Tiki and Heyerdahl's other imaginative and original documentaries. (Non-fiction)

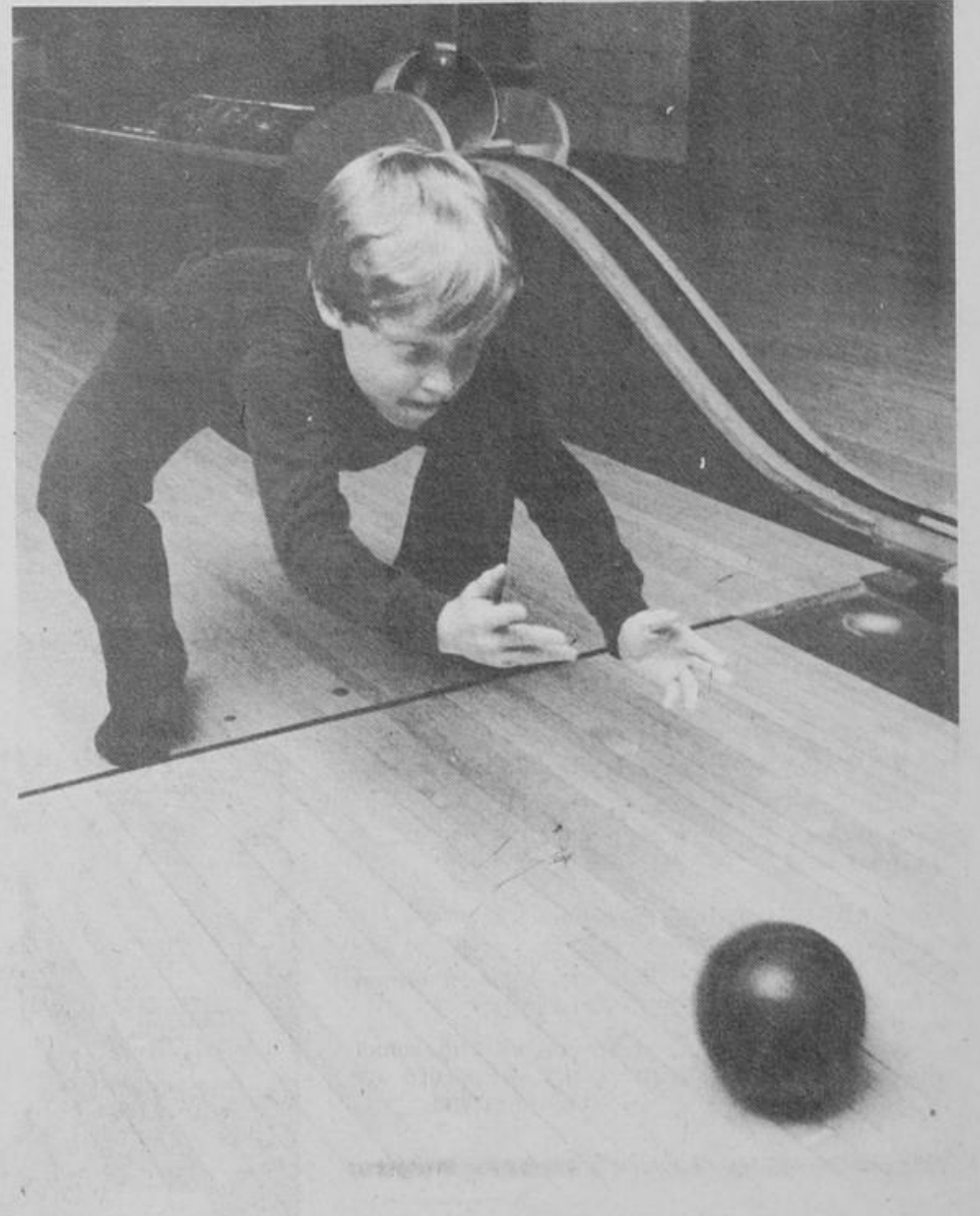
