Allow snack bar at Bradstock Park

Richmond Hill Minor Ball Association will be permitted to construct a storage building and snack bar at Bradstock Park at no cost to the town, council decided Monday night on recommendation of the parks and recreation committee.

Parks Director David Hamilton assured Regional Councillor Lois Hancey that the ball association will be responsible for clean-ups.

Mrs. Hancey expressed concern about introducing a snack bar into a residential area, since experience shows that this often leads to candy wrappers, paper cups etc. being dropped on the ground and carried by the wind on to people's lawns. Mayor David Schiller also pointed out that positioning of the facility is important and that efforts will be made to place it so that it will cause the least problem for nearby residents.
