Midget hockey tourney ... hurt by mail strike

The mail strike is causing planning problems for the 1976 Richmond Hill International Midget Hockey Tournament.

Team Registrar Don Bromley reported this week 66 application forms posted to midget clubs in Canada and the U.S. on the first day of the strike are hung up.

As a result, team managements are being contacted by telephone and approximately 22 clubs have so far confirmed a desire to participate.

Although the seven day ninth annual tourney is not slated to commence until March 22, team applications are

required to be in by December 1 in order that organizers may make equitable selections for the final 32 team schedule.

Players lists are also required several months ahead in order that programs may be prepared and printed.

Should the postal dispute continue into December, Registrar Bromley said a contingency plan will be instituted to select the 32 teams.

At a recent meeting of Tournaments Incorporated, the non-profit organization which operates the annual event, 13 officers were named for the

1975-76 season. They include: President Marsh Amos; Vice-President Russ Andrews; Secretary-Treasurer John Clephan. Directors are, Don Bromley, Harold Barnett, Doug Hopson, Sterling Reid, Stan Thornington, Walter Donkin, Harold O'Rourke and Eric Chapman.

Voting members of the executive committee include Bob Reeves, president of the Richmond Hill Hockey Association and George Wood, president of the Royal Canadian Legion branch 375.

Approximately 25 additional members also form part of the tournament operating staff.


