Death of an old elm tree

trailblazerr **OUTDOORS WITH** Alex Eberspaecher

Near Dundas, Ontario, is a tree that is 79 feet high with a diameter of 60 inches.

This tree is 15-8" around and the crown spread is an impressive 112

Being an Elm tree, to be specific, an American Elm, this tree can grow for over 300 years.

The American Elm tree was once the most common and one of the most beautiful shade trees in all of North America.

There was hardly a farm in eastern Canada that didn't have a driveway lined with elms. Cattle and elms must have been inseparable, as there are dead elms in nearly every pasture. Started in 1921

Nobody knows for sure how it all started, but it was in 1921 that the Elm Disease was discovered. During that year, the first known tree died in the Netherlands, and from then on it was called the Dutch Elm Disease.

Because we value our trees more than the people of Europe do, we import logs from overseas to be turned into furniture. Unfortunately, during 1930, a diseased log was brought in and the disease spread uncontrolled from then on.

A fungus The disease is actually a fungus, which infects the tree, blocking the vital water canals under the bark, and eventually killing the tree. There is only one answer, it must be felled and burned

The fungus is spread by the European Elm Bark Beetle. Our own American Bark Beetle also decided to jump on the bandwagon and help out as well.

We can stop pollution and sometimes even wars, but not this tiny little beetle.

Originally we had six native elms in North America, all of them susceptible to the disease. Over the years, we have developed new hybrids which are resistant, but, unfortunatley, not completely immune to this killer.

No elms Ontario has lost almost all of its Elms and the few remaining ones show definite symptons.

One year the tree is in full foliage, the next you can find the first dry leaves and branches, and from there on it is all downhill, with the complete tree being destroyed in three or four years.

The disease is travelling eastward, and travellers can follow the progress, especially along the beautiful Elm-lined banks of the St.

John River in New Brunswick. Biologists are working on a cure, but are as far from one as they were

ten years ago. However, there is a method to preserve healthy trees by innoculating them regularly, but it is my understanding that the cost is approximately \$200. per tree.

A local tree surgeon is supposedly an authority on this and hopefully I will be able to report how successful this method is proving.

In the meantime, I suggest you get some good pictures of healthy Elm trees, because very soon, that will be your only reminder of the stately and beautiful American Elm Tree.




