By-law No. 143-75 affects the lands within Plans M-1589, M-1590 and M-1591. It deletes certain sections in By-law 3-74. These refer to minimum requirements for apartment buildings respecting the location and enclosure of play space area and screening. The municipality has amended By-law 3-74 by a by-law pursuant to Section 35a of The Planning Act and the deleted sections are no longer necessary since control of such matters will be effected and maintained by an agreement entered into prior to the issuance of a building permit.
