NOTICE OF THE APPLICATION TO THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL FOR APPROVAL OF A BY-LAW TO REGULATE LAND USE PASSED PURSUANT TO SECTION 35 OF THE PLANNING ACT.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 of the Planning Act for approval of By-law 143-75 passed on the 3rd day of November, 1975.

A note giving an explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished below.

ANY PERSONS INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSONS wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Richmond Hill notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DAY FOR filing objections will be the 5th day of January, 1976.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL BY-LAW NO. 143-75

A By-law to Amend By-law 3-74 WHEREAS the matters herein set out are in conformity with the Official Plan of the Town of Richmond Hill which is approved and in force at this time.

AND WHEREAS there has been no amendment to the Official Plan of the Town of Richmond Hill proposed by Council but not approved at this time with which the matters herein set out are not in conformity.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. By-law No. 3-74 as amended, be and is hereby further amended by

(a) Deleting paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of section 6.1.1.1.
(b) Deleting Section 6.1.1.2.

READ A FIRST TIME THIS 3rd DAY OF NOVEMBER 1975.

READ A SECOND TIME THIS 3rd DAY OF NOVEMBER 1975.

READ A THIRD TIME AND FINALLY PASSED THIS 3rd DAY OF NOVEMBER 1975.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMOND HILL EXPLANATORY NOTE TO BY-LAW NO. 143-75
By-law No. 143-75 affects the lands within Plans M-1589, M-1590 and M-1591. It deletes certain sections in By-law 3-74. These refer to minimum requirements for apartment buildings respecting the location and enclosure of play space area and screening. The municipality has amended By-law 3-74 by a by-law pursuant to Section 35a of the Planning Act and the deleted sections are no longer necessary since control of such matters will be effected and maintained by an agreement entered into prior to the issuance of a building permit.

Seek housing for patients

York Region's health and social service agencies are attempting to find a solution to supplying houses for patients who need them.

Many patients are forced to return to situations which caused their problems because temporary or inexpensive housing is scarce, said Dave Burns of the York Central Mental Health Unit.

Identifying their housing needs recently at a meeting at York Central Hospital were representatives of 10 agencies.

Richmond Hill has no emergency housing, and the region's few halfway houses are full, he said. Burns said York Central Hospital has no money to set up the homes, but a joint effort could solve the problem.
