THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF RICHMONDHILL BY-LAW NO. 84-75 EXPLANATORY NOTE

The lands affected by this by-law were formerly in the Township of Whitchurch consisting Lots 61-70 inclusive on Concession 1 and the westerly halves of Lots 1-10 inclusive in Concession 2. They were annexed to the Town of Richmond Hill but remain subject to the provisions of Whitchurch By-law No. 1703. By-law No. 1703 provides that all building lots must front on a public street or highway.

The effect of By-law No. 84-75 is to redefine the term "street or highway" to make it clear that a road must have been assumed by the Town of Richmond Hill or Regional Municipality of York or the Province of Ontario or being constructed under agreement with the Town before it qualifies as a street or highway for the purposes






