





Committee of Adjustment

Jurisdiction

to hear applications for minor variances to the Zoning By-laws of the Town and to rule on the legalization of each as provided under The Planning Act of Ontario.

Remuneration: \$25.00 per meeting

Appointments: One member for a 3 year term

Parks and Recreation Committee

Jurisdiction

To assist in the development and to recommend to Council policies which will improve the parks and recreation services of the municipality.

Appointments: Six in all, preferably one from each Ward.

Special Note: The six resident members will be joined by five members of Council (including the Mayor) to comprise a Committee of eleven. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Committee will be a member of Council other than the Mayor.

The operating budget of the Parks & Recreation Department for 1975 was approximately \$537,000.00.

Civic Improvement Committee

Jurisdiction

To assist in the development and to recommend to Committees of Council policies which will improve the physical and cultural amenities of the municipality.

Appointments: Twelve in all, preferably two from each Ward, with a minimum of four appointments to persons not presently sitting as members.

Fence Viewers

Jurisdiction

To arbitrate disputes pursuant to the provisions of The Line Fences Act of Ontario. Appointments: Three Fence Viewers to serve a one year term.

Library Board

Jurisdiction

To serve as representative of the Municipality on the Library Board.

Appointments: One member for a three year term.

Property Standards Committee

Jurisdiction

To hear appeals made against orders of the Property Standards Officer and to confirm, guash or modify the officer's order.

Appointments: Three appointments in all. One for a one year term; one for a two year term; and one for a three year term.

Remuneration under review
