RICHMOND HILL — Richmond Hill Rams edged Markham Waxers 5-4 last Thursday, Feb. 12 on the strength of third period goals, 11 seconds apart, by Ben Pederson and Rick Febbo.

A power play situation created the opportunity for Mike Rowley of the Rams to open the scoring at 6:10 of the first frame, two seconds after a Markham penalty expired. Assists went to Jack Guest and Jim Clement. Markham's Mike Anderson knotted the score on a pass from Pat Morrison less than three minutes later as Rams gave up the puck in their own zone.

Rams' Mike Rowley netted his second marker at 13:31 to up the score to 2-1 for Richmond Hill. A shot by Ken Paraskevin was turned aside by Markham's Dave Hillier, but Rick Febbo rapped the loose puck to Rowley in the slot who fired it past a startled Hillier.

Lead 3-1

Rams pushed the score to 3-1 on a power play goal by Bob Osborne to close out the first period scoring. Rick Febbo and Joe Greentree drew assists on the play.

Markham stormed out in the second period to score two goals 33 seconds apart to tie the score at 3-3.

Doug Todd rammed in a power play goal at the 24 second mark. Doug Feasby and Tom McLeod picked up-

assists. Thirty-three seconds later, Wayne Lucas, after taking a pass from Dean Willers, executed some crafty stickhandling as he outmanoeuvred Bill Stephenson inside the blue line and then deked Brian Stankiewicz and shovelled the puck home.

Tom McLeod gave Markham a 4-3 lead at 14:32 of the second period. Peter Sikorski and Doug Feasby drew assists on the play.

Rams came to life again in the third period for two markers 11 seconds apart.

Crisp relays from Bill Stephenson and Bob Osborne sent Ben Pederson in alone from the blue line. Pederson cleanly beat Hillier with a low shot to tie the score at four apiece.

Richmond Hill hung on for the balance of the game and a 5-4 win.
