Too many taxi cabs?

RICHMOND HILL - Are there too many taxis in Richmond Hill?

A majority of town council thinks so, and Monday it took steps to reduce the number, by attrition, from 87 to 60.

The taxi bylaw was amended to allow all present licences to be renewed by March 31, but the number will be frozen as of that date even if some licences are

In addition, any licences cancelled or gun training centre revoked in future will not be reissued to new applicants until the total number has been reduced to a maximum of 60. Councillor William Corcoran was the
