

gradually evaporate as the onions are cooked without a cover. Use enough water to cover the onions by about one-half inch. Depending

on the onions, the cooking time will vary from 15 to 40 minutes. Preferably choose

small Ontario onions, about one to two inches in diameter for cooking whole and cook them uncovered.

Drain well and add enough butter to lightly coat the onions. Served sprinkled with chopped parsley. Or serve with medium thick cream sauce or mild cheese sauce.


