Suspension policy aired

RICHMOND HILL — "It's the troublesome part of the year", separate schools education director John Zupancic commented last week in a report to the board on student discipline problems. Zupancic told trustees of recent suspensions and said principals these days prefer to suspend troublemakers rather than beat them. "I agree it's a better method than

corporal punishment," Zupancic said. "The purpose of a suspension is communication with parents, to get the parents involved in discussion of behavior problems." Zupancic noted that while this is traditionally a time of year when students get restless, "there's not really that much trouble considering the total number of students."

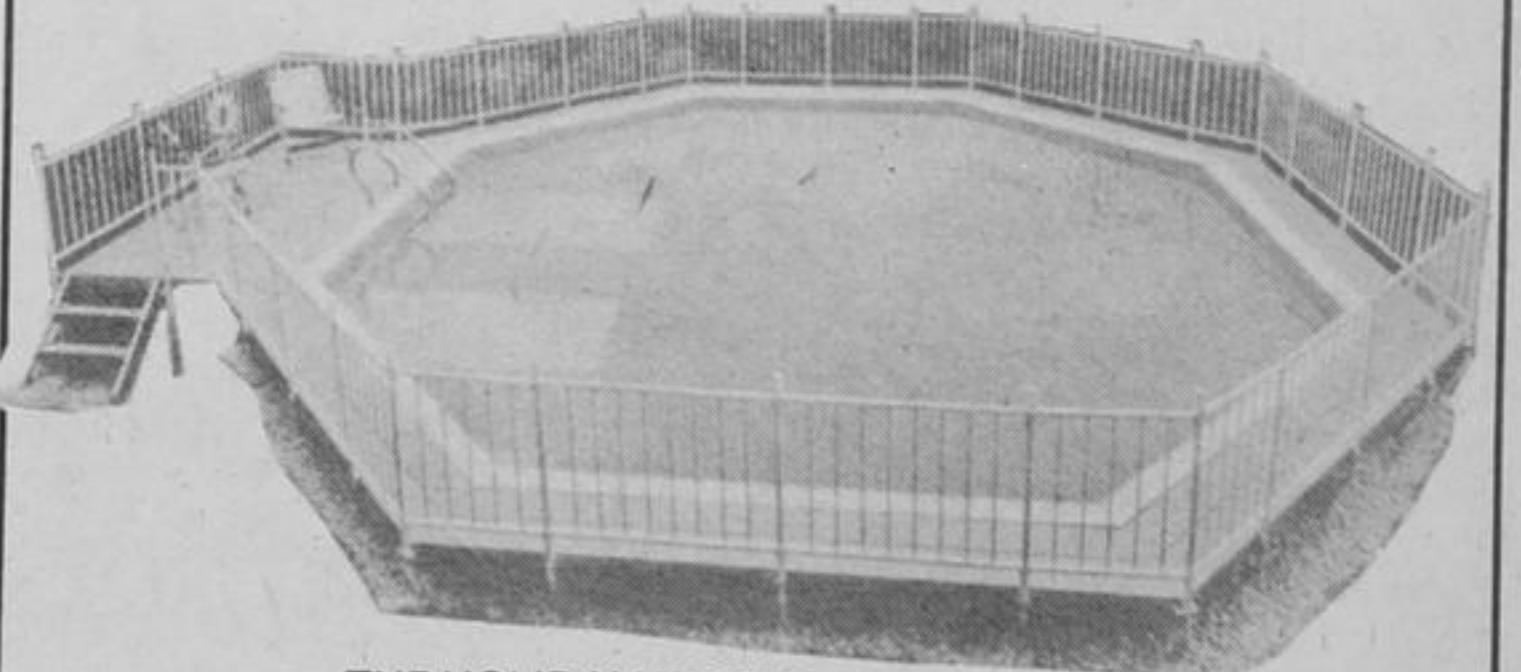

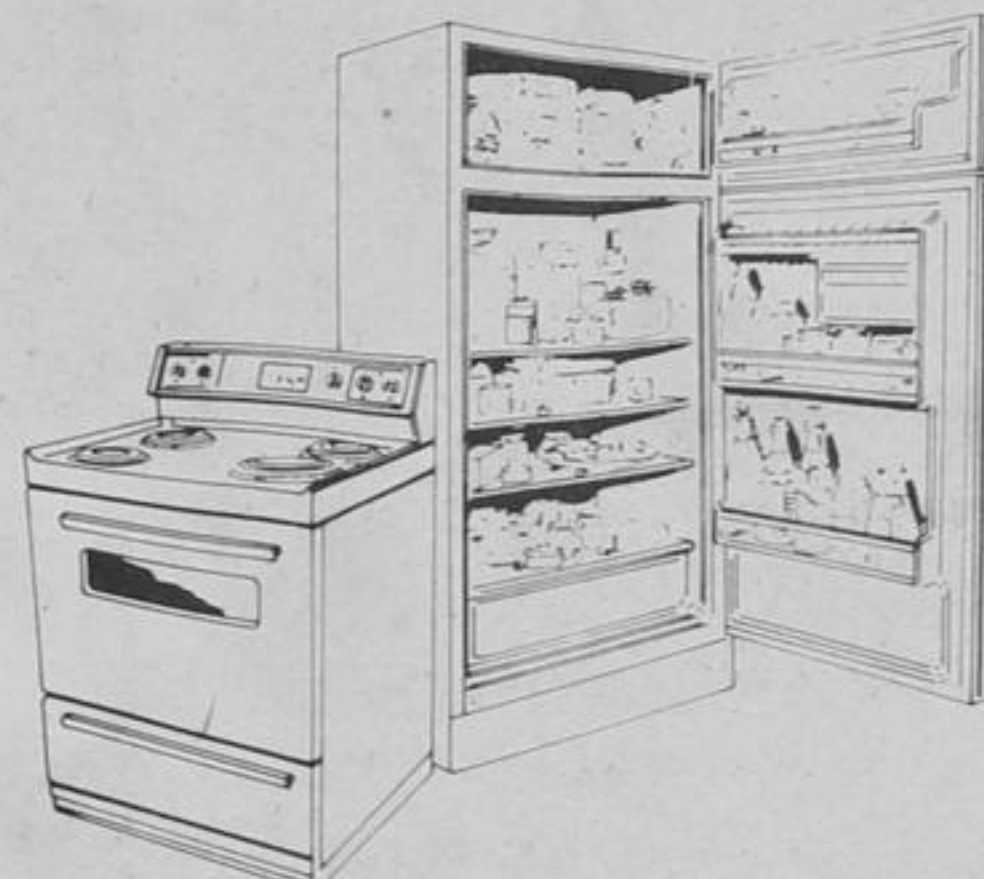

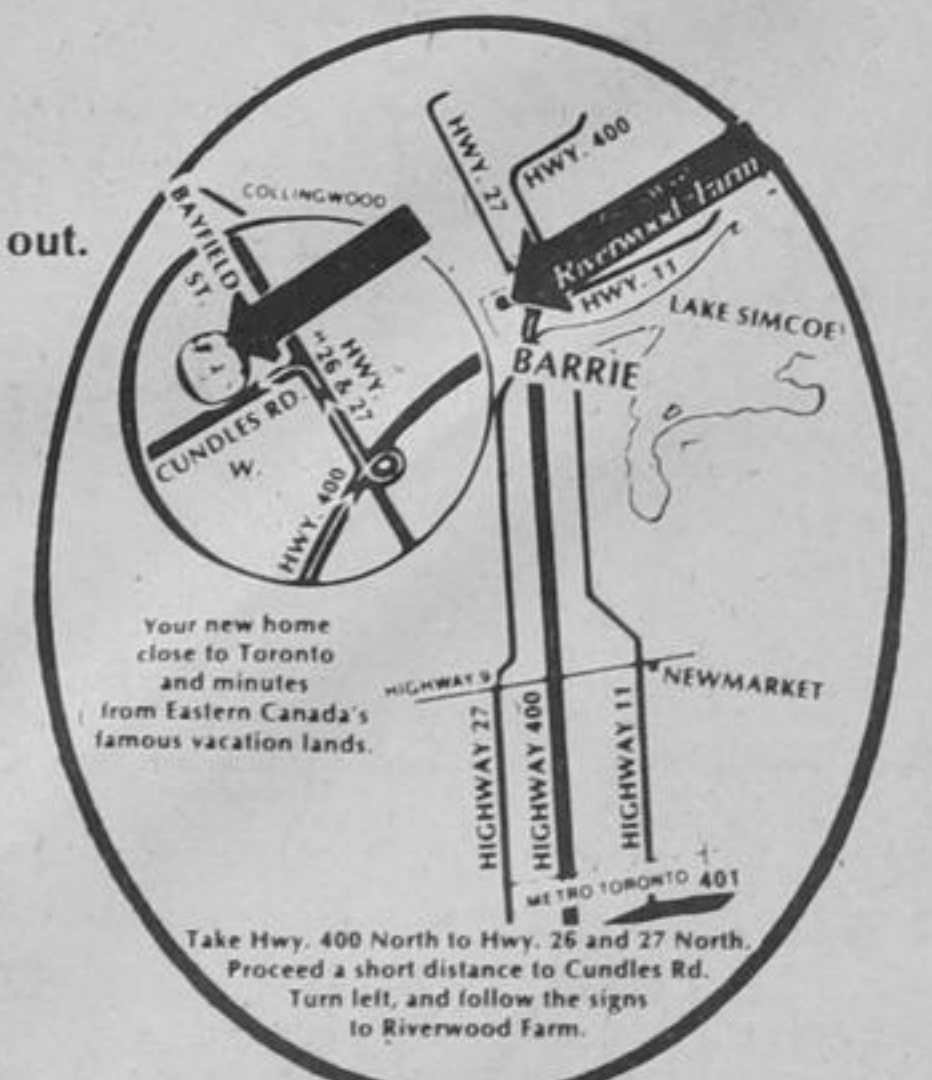
