

> which went bankrupt in April 1971. At the time, a list of the company's debts totalled \$290,000. It had sold chinchillas at \$350 to

\$1,300 each to Canadians seeking to profit from breeding them. The guild had offered a

buy-back arrangement in which it promised to buy all animals produced by the breeders. But the guarantee became worthless when the guild went bankrupt, and an estimated 2,500 people were left with their chinchillas.
