1976 roads and transportation budget. Total revenue is \$1,684,000, made up of a carry over from 1975 of \$200,000, subsidies in the amount

of \$554,000 and general taxation of \$930,000. Total expenditure is \$1,614,000 and is broken down into \$175,000 for engineering and overhead, \$19,200 for a debenture (Kirby and Rutherford), \$105,000 for transportation, \$560,000 for maintenance, \$194,800

for construction, and \$560,000 for new work. This leaves a surplus of \$70,000 for additional projects during 1976.
